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DENVER EISTEDDFOD.

An Immediate Building to Be Erected for Next Fall's Gathering.

ABUNDANCE OF TRANSPORTATION

To and From the Auditorium Is Provided by the Street Car Companies—Accommodations for 12,000.

When the Cambrian association of Utah voted last fall to give Denver the next annual Eisteddfod, the people of the "Centennial" city discovered that they had a white elephant on their hands, for it was soon known that no building in Denver was large enough to hold the assembly. Not to be daunted, however, the Eisteddfod committee set to work, determined to secure a building by erecting one especially for the occasion. On the 15th of last month their efforts met with success, for on that date a contract was entered into between the Arlington Park company and the Denver Eisteddfod association in which it was agreed that Arlington Park, situated about a mile and a half southwest of Denver City, should be the place to erect a building and give the Eisteddfod.

The agreement was entered into for the two parties provided for the building of the park by the Eisteddfod association for five years, and the erection of a permanent building with accommodations for 12,000 people.

The building will be constructed of wood, with a heavy canvas roof and will cost \$20,000. It will be 120 feet wide by 200 feet deep.

The main part of the auditorium, which will be provided with comfortable seats and backs, will seat about 5,000.
