### EVENTS IN THE WEST.

A Record of Occurrences in Neighboring States and Territories.

#### ALARMING REPORTS FROM LAKE BENNETT

Analogy for Overland Travel. Statement of River Alarmed. Reported from an Officer—Missouri.

A deserter from the British infantry, mentioned in the year's imprisonment at Fort Leavenworth, escaped from the guard house at Fort Leavenworth, Thursday, and has not yet been recaptured.

"We are prepared today to capture or destroy any force that Spain could send, and assist the Pacific Coast," said Rear Admiral Kirkland of the Navy. "I have no doubt that the first place, the Spanish government has no vessels in the Pacific waters, except the frigates."

We have a greater force than that Spain, and can easily take care of the Spanish fleet. The next possibility line in sending a fleet through the straits of Magellan. We have 20 monitors, the Monitor and the Monterey, that are more than a match for any vessel in the Pacific. Besides these two we have the Benington and the Mowbray, which are new from the Hawaiian Islands. The Charleston will be in commission by May 1st, and if it were necessary we could have the Yorktown and Philadelphia in fighting trim by the 1st of June. What I rely upon largely to complete our coast defense are the ten vessels recently acquired. Another valuable adjunct to our Pacific coast defense is the three torpedo boats now waiting completion in the Sound. This number can be increased materially, if the necessary appropriations are made, and we could have each ready only six days for building."

#### FOUNTAIN GREEN NEWS NOTES.

Executive Sheep Shearing Business Now on at That Place—Other Items.

Fountain Green, April 20, 1898.

To the Editor: As the train came to a halt at Water Hill, on the divide above Fountain Green, we could hear the click of the shears. The wonderful growth of the sheep shearing camp located there, a gang of men were at work and sheep were being loaded on into the big wood-racks that were hung on huge frames, with wide open mouths to receive the wonderful growth of wool from the backs of the sheep, which have been watched and guarded with such care through summer heat and winter frost by the herdsmen. The number of men at the point to take of the sheep, in the day the drought consumed me, and I tried to fight, but my sheep departed from my eyes."

To follow the path, and by these sheep were taken to the point at this place, would be a very tedious and profitable journey, but the herdsmen now shearing from six to seven pounds per head, have followed on day by day, night by night, exposed to the drought, by summer, and the furrows of the past winter on the desert, away down west of the city. Some seventy thousand sheep will be shorn up on the divide north of town, one of the largest shearing being Mr. A. T. Angard of this place. Fountain Green has other shepherds, some six are in the missionary field at present.

#### Idaho Weather Report.

Idaho weather for the week ending Monday, April 18, 1898, was generally dry and warm, with an abundance of sunshine, conditions highly favorable for farming operations. The soil is for the most part, in good condition for working. In the Snake River there are complaints of drought, while in other localities excessive moisture is reported. The snow has disappeared rapidly, and is now present only in patches in the mountainous districts. The streams are rising slowly. Plowing and seeding are well advanced in all agricultural sections, and in the earlier parts the crops are much improved. Stock wintered well and has generally been turned out on the ranges.
