

Bridge Burned. - The Southern

Pacific Railroad Company's bridge across the Colorado River at Fort Yunni, Arizona, was totally destroyed by fire on Saturday. Breaking out about noon, the flames spread so rapidly that all efforts to save the valuable structure were without avail. Immediately on receipt of the telegram announcing the threatened destruction of the bridge, Assistant General Super-Intendent R. H. Pratt dispatched two wrecking trains to the scene of the fire. Temporary arrangements for the transfer of freight and passengers were made at once, and but little time will e lost by the overland express trains for the next few weeks, although It will doubtless be some months before the bridge cuabe replaced.
