A Dutch statistician has computed that in England 1 1/2 pounds of coffee are consumed annually for each person; in France, 2 1/2 pounds; Germany, 4 pounds; Denmark, 5 1/2 pounds; Switzerland, 6 pounds; Belgium, 8 1/2 pounds; Holland, 10 1/2 pounds; and in the United States 7 pounds for each person. In England, tea is more frequently chosen as the breakfast beverage. One cause of the difference in the consumption of coffee by various nations may be attributed to the practice of adulteration. In England, particularly, roasted barley, roasted beans, and other counterfeits, are largely sold as coffee, and even when coffee is sold, chicory is mixed with it to such an extent that it is no exaggeration to say that of the stuff retailed as ground coffee in that country more than half never grew on a coffee plant.

It is estimated that there are now about 2,500 cotton and woolen factories in the United States, of which 87 are cotton factories in the cotton-raising, southern and southwestern States, with about 224,000 spindles. Others are projected in those States and the number will doubtless be very much increased in the course of a few years. The largest number of mills is now found in Georgia, where there are 21, with 69,782 spindles. North Carolina has 17 mills and 24,249 spindles; Virginia and Tennessee 10 each, with an aggregate of 49,780 spindles. Of the northern and western States, Massachusetts leads, having 598 cotton and woolen mills; Pennsylvania has 517 mills; New York, 365; Rhode Island, 284; Connecticut, 284; New Hampshire, 150; Illinois, 138; New Jersey, 118; Indiana, 115; Ohio, 114; Maine, 100; Vermont, 69; Michigan, 55; Iowa, 52; Wisconsin, 42; Oregon, 8; Kansas, 7; and California, 9; Utah, 6.

The editor of a New York paper (who probably knows) calculates the amount of money spent for drinks. He says: "Leaving wines and expensive liquors quite out of the question, let us see what a plain cocktail or modest imbibor of the old rye is likely to disburse on his favorite refreshments in the course of a year. Take a very moderate man as a sample. Assume that he drinks every day one glass of ale at ten cents, and four glasses of whisky at fifteen. That amounts to seventy cents a day, which makes four dollars and ninety cents a week. Multiply by four, and you have nineteen dollars and sixty cents a month, which comes, you know, to two hundred and fifty-two dollars and twenty cents a year. Thus, if the man who had carried on at this rate for ten years had all his liquor money back, his pocket would be inflated to the tune of over two thousand dollars. This is only a small beer calculation; but think of men who spend five times that amount on liquors, and remember that their name is legion."
