

## CREEL COMING ON SPECIAL MISSION

Purpose Not Definitely Known but It Is in Connection With the Nicaraguan Situation.

### MEXICO IS MUCH INTERESTED

Ex-Ambassador, It Is Believed, Will Define Exactly Attitude of Mexican Government.

Mexico City, Dec. 6.—Enrique Creel, formerly Mexican ambassador to the United States and now governor of Chihuahua, will leave Mexico City tomorrow night for Washington, where he goes on a special mission connected with the Nicaraguan situation.

It is known in Mexico City that the Mexican government has received a reply to the letter sent by Foreign Minister Mariscal to the United States government in which he outlined a plan for the peaceful settlement of the Nicaraguan problem, but the foreign office refuses to divulge its contents.

Government officials continue to maintain extreme reserve when discussing the Nicaraguan situation. It is believed Gov. Creel is going to state concisely the attitude of the Mexican government in this matter. Since he arrived from Chihuahua last week he has had conferences with President Diaz and has spent much time at the foreign office with Minister Mariscal. At his apartments he has received high government officials, including Vice President Corral.

"The only amicable intervention that would be acceptable would be that of two Latin-American powers that could guarantee in Nicaragua the election of a president by a popular vote. A government composed of Zelayas would mean simply a new war in the future."

### WASHINGTON HAS NO OFFICIAL INFORMATION

Washington, Dec. 6.—No official information has reached here of the purpose of Mr. Creel, the former Mexican ambassador to the United States, to come to Washington as the representative of Mexico to make certain representations to the state department concerning the Nicaraguan situation. His reported mission is to co-operate in this matter with Dr. Luis Anderson, former minister of foreign affairs of the Costa Rican government.

It is said at the state department

that Mr. Anderson's only mission in Washington is in connection with the boundary dispute between Costa Rica and Panama and the announcement is officially made that Chief Justice Fuller of the United States supreme court has consented to act as arbitrator in that dispute. His decision, it is understood, will be final and binding upon both parties.

The statement authoritatively is made that the Mexican government is in full accord with the views and purposes of the United States with respect to Nicaragua and that they will sustain this government in carrying out these policies.

Prominent members of the senate committee on foreign relations found it an intriguing subject for discussion when they met on the floor of the senate today.

The Democrats inclined to the opinion that Secretary Knox might have acted hastily in holding President Zelaya personally responsible for the execution of the Americans, Cannon and Groce. At the same time they said they would withhold judgment until they had an opportunity to consult with officials of the state department or receive a message from President Taft concerning the serious phases of the relations of the United States with the Central American ruler.

### RIVAL FACTIONS HAVE BEGUN INTIGUING

San Jose, del Sur, Dec. 7.—The rival factions that have combined to overthrow President Zelaya are now reported to be intriguing for predominance in sharing the prospective spoils and are exerting themselves to gain the influence of Washington. At Managua it is reported that Costa Ricans are protesting publicly against an American intervention in Central America.

### VASSAR GIRL DROWNS HERSELF IN A CISTERN

Fishkill Landing, N. Y., Dec. 6.—The body of Margaret Dauerty, the Vassar student who disappeared yesterday, was found late today in the cistern of her father's home at Hughestown.

Miss Dauerty, who was the daughter of the Rev. William H. Dauerty, wandered away from the care of her friends yesterday morning. It was known that she had been forced to abandon her studies at Vassar because of mental strain due to overwork.

A detective found her body in six feet of water at the bottom of the cistern. Appearances indicate a carefully planned suicide.

There was no evidence of foul play. Miss Dauerty was ambitious to make her first year at Vassar a creditable one. She knew that her father had abandoned a rich parish in New Jersey to accept his small parish in Hughestown that his daughter might live at home while attending Vassar.

Three weeks ago she broke down. The thought that her disposition had nullified her father's sacrifices for her so preyed on her mind that the family feared she might attempt suicide and tried to keep a close watch on her. Sunday morning she disappeared, and many searching parties failed to find her until late today.

### CAN'T TAKE TIPS.

Loeb Will Fire Any Custom House Employee Who Does.

New York, Dec. 6.—"Not a man shall remain in this service who accepts a tip from a passenger," said Collector Loeb today, and in the next sentence he dismissed Charles Nimmo, a customs inspector who had been in the service since 1886.

"I am determined to break up that practice and I want the public to know that not a cent need be paid any employee of this port for any service the government pays its agents to perform," added the collector. Customs authorities learned that Nimmo had loaned a passenger sufficient money to pay duty on excess of baggage and afterward gone to the passenger's home to collect the loan.

New York, Dec. 6.—"There is a good deal of rot in all this peace talk," Gen. Leonard Wood told members of the St. Nicholas society at their annual banquet tonight. "We don't need to be a war-like nation, but we want to be ready," he continued. "The American seaports are not well guarded. We can not increase the army in time of peace and it is imperative therefore to increase the navy if you wish to protect our coasts adequately."

## CRUSADE AGAINST WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC

Washington, Dec. 6.—Suppression of the "white slave" traffic will become the slogan of an increasingly powerful movement to which President Taft has given much encouragement in his comments to those who have consulted with him on the subject.

This fact gives new importance to the reintroduction by Representative James of Illinois of his bill prescribing drastic penalties for those convicted of these practices.

The bill would make it a crime for

any person to aid, entice or force any girl or woman to go from one state to another for immoral purposes, whether with or without her consent, with a penalty of five years imprisonment or a fine of \$3,000. If the girl be 13 years old the penalty provided is 10 years imprisonment and \$5,000 fine.

The bill also seeks to carry out the arrangement with foreign nations known as "the white slave traffic agreement" under which keepers of immoral resorts are required to make complete reports to the commissioner general of immigration. That official is required to collect information concerning alien women of this class.

### MIGUEL'S CREDITORS SUE FOR A MILLION

Buda Pest, Dec. 6.—According to the newspapers, a syndicate of creditors is suing Prince Miguel of Braganza, who married Miss Anita Stewart of New York, last September, for \$1,000,000. Some years ago, a paper says, Prince Miguel was in financial difficulties and the syndicate advanced him a large sum payable when he should make a rich marriage. The claim is set up that following negotiations which resulted in his marriage to Miss Anita Stewart, the prince promised to repay the syndicate the one-fifth of the dowry, which was \$5,000,000.

Now Prince Miguel declines to pay anything beyond the amount borrowed.

Rector Torp Appointed Committee of Learned Men to Receive Them.

Copenhagen, Dec. 6.—Rector Torp of the University of Copenhagen, Chancellor Salomonsen and Prof. Ellis Stromgren, have been delegated to receive the north polar records of Dr. Frederick A. Cook on behalf of the university.

These records are being brought here by Dr. Cook's secretary, who arrived at Christiansand yesterday. A committee of examination will soon be appointed.

The president of the committee will be Prof. Stromgren and the other members will be made up of scientists and explorers, such as Commodore Hovgaard.
