TOTAL REVENUE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE U. S. FROM MARCH 4, 1879, TO JUNE 30, 1879.

Washington, Nov. 1, 1874.

There has been prepared in the Warrant Division of the Treasury Department, under the supervision of Mr. Charles F. Conant, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, a statement of the receipts of the government from March 4, 1879 (the date of the inauguration of the present form of administration), to June 30, 1879. This statement has been prepared as an index to the detailed statement of the annual receipts for the same period. The work is so careful, accurate and complete that full details of any particular item may be had by reference to the proper page in the ledger. The following is a recapitulation of the entire receipts for that period, classified according to the sources of revenue:

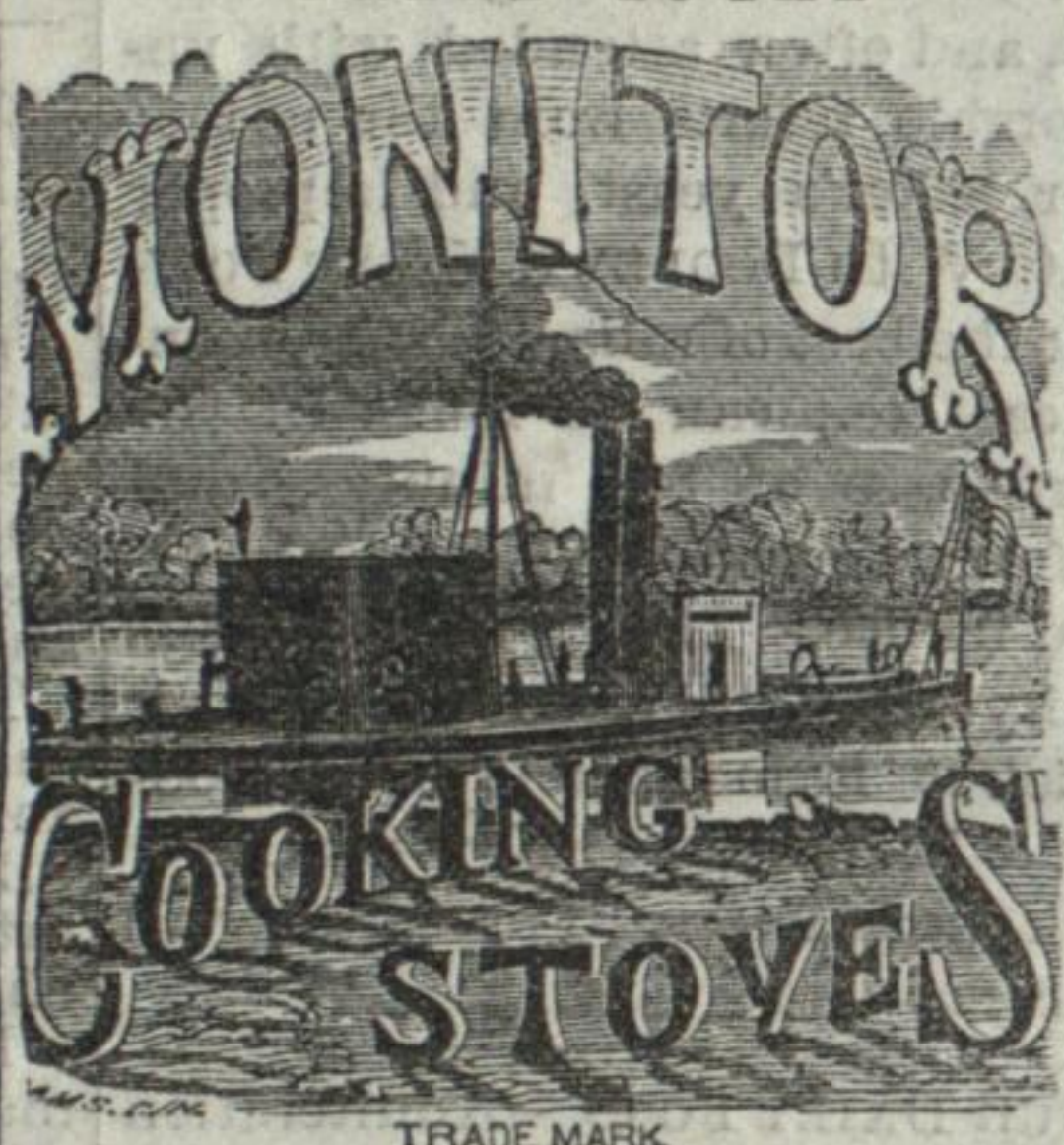

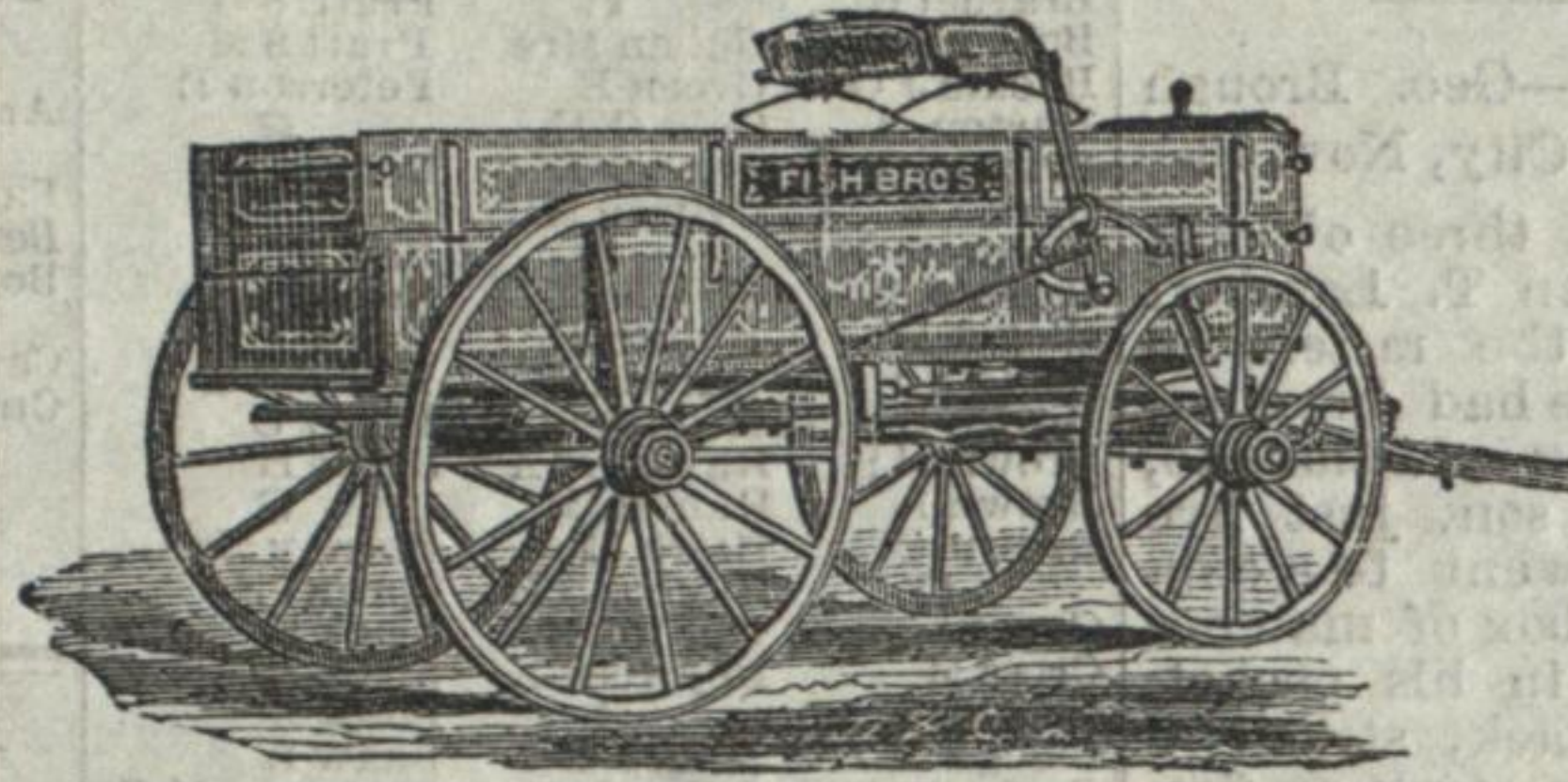
