

ing them to bring in a verdict of guilty if they are satisfied of the prisoner's guilt, and to acquit him if they are sure he is innocent. They don't winnow wheat from the chaff or marshal facts or point out inferences to be drawn, but drop sacks of rubbish which they admit is evidence into the jury box, and expect 12 men chosen according to the American system, because of their imbecile ignorance to render justice. Why do not the American people who aim at efficiency in all their things secure trained lawyers for judges and see that great cases like this are committed to competent counsel?"

A heavy gale prevailed throughout the United Kingdom, Saturday and Sunday, doing serious damage to property. Nearly the whole of the new pier at Falkestone was washed ashore, and there were many wrecks along the coast.

About forty persons were injured in the late gale, are being treated in the London hospitals. It is feared some cases will prove fatal. Fifty barges have been sunk in the Thames. Extensive floods are reported in the upper Thames Valley.

The Times has been clamoring for a week past for an extension of the coercive powers of the Government in Ireland and even for a suspension of trial by jury.

The Daily Telegraph demands martial law, and the government appears to be completely nonplussed.

FALMOUTH, 28.—The steamer *Roumalis*, bound for London, has arrived here. She encountered terrific weather. Her decks were swept, boats smashed, and all the cattle, except fifteen, were washed overboard.

QUEBEC, 28.—The steamer *Paleo* arrived to-day with coal, from Sidney. Her masts and decks were covered with a foot of ice. The crew experienced untold sufferings. Temperature early this morning 15 below zero.

The joint letter of Bishops, adopted in 1876, condemnatory of bribery, perjury and other abuses prevalent in times of elections, and exhorting electors to vote according to their conscience, was read yesterday from the pulpits of all the Catholic parishes in the province.

ST. JOHNS, N. B., 28.—A fire to-day destroyed St. Mary's Episcopal Church and Sunday School on Waterloo Street, and Mrs. Spencer's dwelling house.

Ten degrees below zero, at Grand Falls, N. B., this morning.

HALIFAX, 28.—The Bank of Prince Edward's Island has suspended, largely owing to overdrawn accounts. Its affairs are said to be in a bad condition. The cashier has disappeared. The capital of the bank is \$120,000; notes in circulation, \$200,000.

POLK CITY, Polk County, Iowa, Nov. 19, 1881.

Editor Deseret News:

Since my last letter to you Bro. Wallantine and I have labored in several counties in Wisconsin. On the 3d and 4th of September we were present at the Conference held at St. Francis, Minnesota, minutes of which you have published. We then came back to St. Paul, where we took steamer for La Crosse, Wisconsin. Here we expected to find some who were favorable to the cause, as we had the names sent us from Utah, of several persons living here. Here I would remark that where the names of parties to be visited are sent to the Elders they should state whether they were relatives or if friends, state where they resided, when the acquaintance was made, so that the Elder would know how to approach them. From La Crosse we walked back into Eau Claire County, near the south line, where we held a number of meetings, and made many friends. We then worked our way back to La Crosse, took steamer to Dubuque, thence by rail to Clinton County, Iowa, where we labored the past six weeks, baptized six persons and blessed three children. In De Witt we held a number of meetings in the Court House.

We visited a number of families who had once belonged to the Church, but had lost the faith. I cannot imagine any persons more miserable than are those who have backslided.

When the light becomes darkness, how great is that darkness. Some of these treated us well and told us to call again, while others could not abuse us bad enough.

On the 16th inst., I came here to Polk City, which will be my post office for some time. Any of the brethren having relatives living near here, whom they would like me to visit, if they will please send me the addresses and particulars.

I find the people so corrupt and so bigoted that they will not endure sound doctrine, but they have heaped to themselves teachers. I am satisfied that there are many honest ones who have not embraced the gospel, but the vast majority have no faith in religion, and while they fear there is a God, they would give more to satisfy themselves that there is no God, than they would to try and gain his favor.

MIXED SPICE.

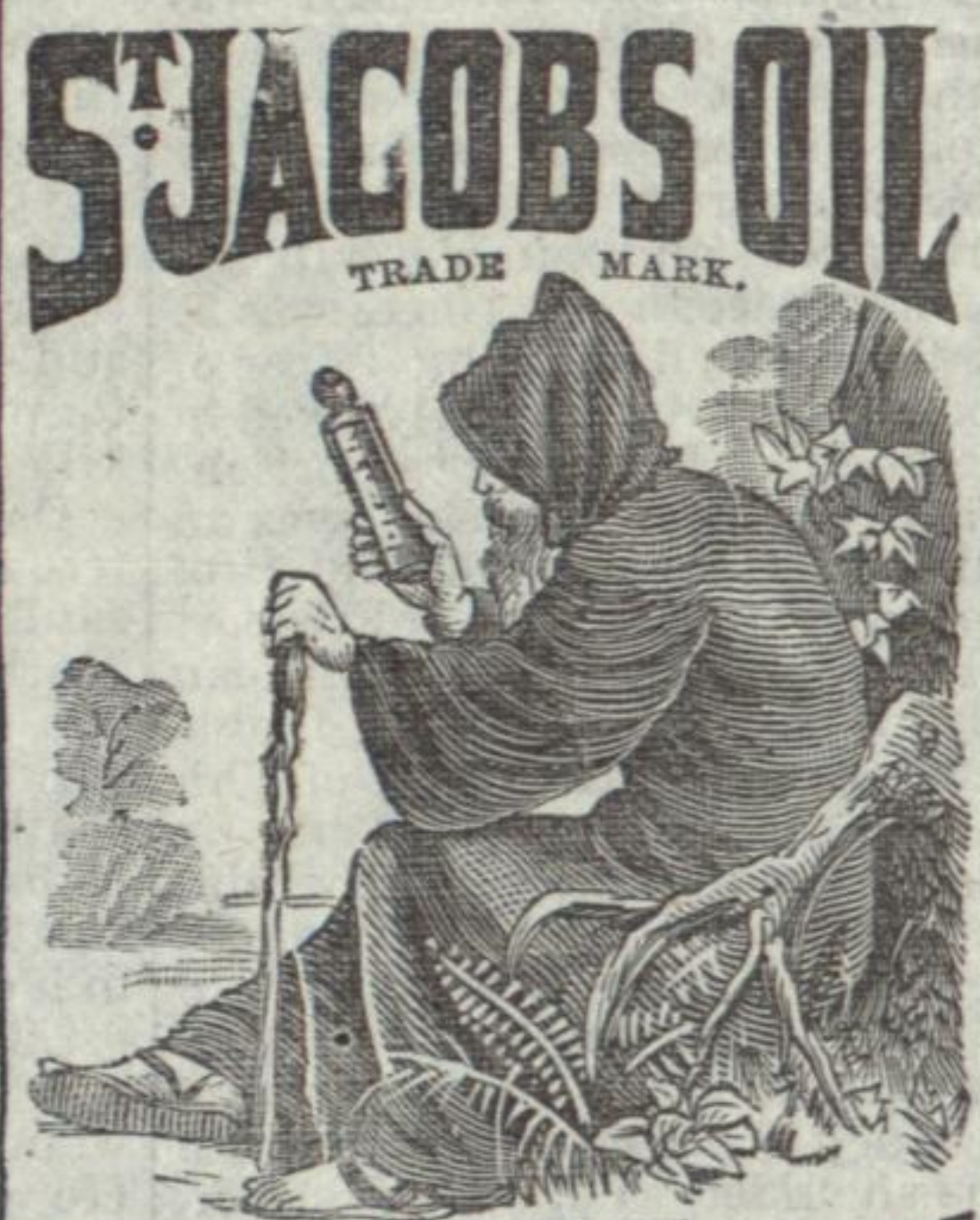
The report that the crematory at Washington, Pa., was going out of favor is denied. It appears that lots of people are just dying to get into it.
