

## REPUBLICAN PRIMARIES.

The Republicans of this city met in their respective precincts at 8:30 o'clock July 6th, at which time delegates were selected to the county convention to be held on Wednesday in the Federal Court room, the delegates to assemble at 11 a. m.

## FIRST PRECINCT.

The voters of the First precinct met in the Second ward.

The meeting was called to order by E. B. Critchlow who proposed L. G. Hardy as chairman. Mr. Hardy was elected. S. J. Kenyon was made secretary and read the call for the meeting.

The First precinct is entitled to 11 delegates and the following were chosen to represent the precinct as delegates in the county convention: C. O. Whittemore, S. J. Kenyon, Solomon Crown, J. G. McAllister, L. G. Hardy, W. D. Gabey, Fred C. Bassett, James Thorp, E. B. Critchlow, Harrison Spiers and Lorenzo Cracroft.

The selection of ward solicitors were as follows, and limited to two in each ward.

First ward—Joseph Thorp and W. C. Graham; Second ward—W. G. Gabey and L. G. Hardy; Tenth ward—Solomon Crown and F. C. Bassett; Ninth ward—J. G. McAllister and George Snellgrove; Eighth ward—C. O. Whittemore and J. P. Sorenson. The Third ward was left for the chair to fill, who appointed Mr. Hardy to report the names, which will appear in due time.

L. G. Hardy was made first vice president and C. O. Whittemore second vice president and S. J. Kenyon secretary and treasurer. The club is to be known as the First Precinct Republican club.

The Republicans of the Second precinct assembled at the county court house and elected delegates to the county and Ogden convention. J. L. Lynch was chosen chairman and Barlow Ferguson secretary.

The following officers were elected: President; James T. Lynch; first vice-president, Douglas E. Brinton; second vice-president, T. D. Lewis; secretary, Barlow Ferguson.

The membership roll of the Second precinct club was signed by twenty voters.

## ASHLEY FARMERS COMBINE.

## Editor Deseret News:

I append a few extracts from the constitution of the proposed Farmers' union in Ashley valley, which may suggest a line of action for the farmers in other sections of the country.

An old settler informed the writer that a majority of the farmers in the valley were interested in the movement. The causes for this action were stated briefly as follow:

The baneful effects of the credit system, low prices allowed for produce by merchants, the difficulty of obtaining cash for produce, etc.

In the organization of the Union, it is proposed that shares be twenty dollars each, and that business be conducted on a cash basis.

## PREAMBLE.

Whereas, Self-preservation is one of the first laws of nature, and it having been deemed necessary for the farmers of Ashley valley to effect a union, to secure that right, and also to assist each other in securing the same, therefore be it

Resolved, First—That we, as farmers and producers in Ashley valley, do hereby most emphatically denounce the credit system that has so handicapped ourselves and our business men, and we do hereby pledge ourselves to use every endeavor to annihilate the system.

Second—That we curtail our expenditures to our necessities, and use every effort to keep from debt.

Third—That we demand cash for our produce, and use every energy to obtain the same, that we may be able to pay

our honest debts, and support our families.

Fourth—That we establish a joint stock company of farmers and producers, and transact our own business, that we may receive the full benefits of our hard labor.

Fifth—That for the above, and all other legitimate objects, we form and adopt this constitution, and agree to support the union with our influence and patronage, and by contributing to its capital stock.

The object of the Union is for the furtherance and development of agriculture in all its branches; the securing of better markets and more uniform prices for all produce, thus enhancing our own and our country's financial condition; to secure contracts; open up new markets, and do general business."

Further developments of this movement will be looked for, and the promoters ought to inform your readers of its success, or give the causes of its failure.
