DELINQUENT TAXES FOR THE YEAR 1903.

Pursuant to Sec. 239 of Chapter 7 of the Revised Statutes of Utah, 1888, as amended by Chapter 78 of the Session Laws of 1901, and the authority vested in me by said section, I, the undersigned, William O. Carbis, Treasurer of Salt Lake County, hereby give public notice that the following named persons are delinquent in the payment of State, School, County, County School, Special School, City and City School taxes for the year 1903, to the amounts set opposite their respective names on the property indicated, reference being hereby made to the assessment rolls of said county, now in my lawful custody for the itemized amounts which go to make up the whole amount of delinquent taxes hereinafter set forth, and the same is hereby made a part of this notice.

Unless said amounts together with costs accrued, are sooner paid by delinquent taxpayers, I shall sell the property hereinafter described, pursuant to section 262, Chapter 7, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1888, of any such delinquents to the highest responsible bidders for cash, in the manner prescribed by law.

Said sale will begin on the third Monday of December, the 21st, 1903, at 12 o'clock noon, at the south front door of the County Court House, Joint City and County Building, Salt Lake City, Utah, and will continue from day to day, until the property of said delinquents is exhausted, or the taxes and costs paid.
