London.—The Commons was densely crowded last night to hear the conclusion of the debate on Gladstone's motion to dis establish the Irish Church. The question was on Stanley's motion to postpone the question to the next Parliament. The Prince and Princess of Wales, and several other membrs of the Royal family stayed in the Royal gallery until the debate closed. The vote was reached at half past two this morning. Six hundred members voted. The government was defeated by sixty majority. The announcement was greeted with wild cheers from the Liberals. On going into committee on Gladstone's resolutions they were carried by a majority of 56. In the committee, Gladstone moved his first resolution, and that the committee report progress. The House acjourned at half-past three.
