

EVERY house in Japan seemed to be overrun with children, in some of which I counted ten or a dozen, and all of about the same size! The birds in a nest, the chickens in a coop, the frogs in a pond, are not more compact and crowded than these human bee-hives seem to be, and I may add, or more happy. The average number of the inmates of each house in Japan is estimated at between thirty and forty! They eat but little meat except fish, which abound in these waters, both in the bays and in the sea, and are easily procured, as well as fine. A gentleman told me that he believed, from his most careful observation, not above one in fifty of the people ever eat any other animal food.—[Mason.]

M. DESOR, a Swiss naturalist, has investigated and confirmed the statement that small fish have been found in Algerian artesian wells two hundred feet deep. These fish belong to the carp species. They are healthy, and have fine, large and perfect eyes. Subterranean fish are usually blind, on account of the uselessness of eyes to such creatures.
