Discovery of Another Comet.

Prof. Henry, of the Smithsonian

Institute received the following

telegram to-day: A comet was

discovered by Temple at Lake-

view, Oregon, on October 23, 1877.

October 23, right ascension 23

hours, 51 minutes; declination south

10° 19'; daily motion 90 minutes,

toward the southward. The comet

has a small bright tail.

The Building Committee.
