

A DAY OF DIVIDENDS.

By Nine of the State Do the Right Thing by Their Stockholders.

REED AND BULLION-BECK DECLARE.

Dear King, Bond Central and Swans
Pay—The La Sals Mountains—On the
Stock Exchange.

This was a brilliant day with nine of
Treasors for paying mines, the amount
being \$16,250, a portion of
which was distributed, the remainder
as minimums in five and ten days
more.

As is usual on the 10th of each
month the mineral company came for-
ward with a dividend of \$10,000 which
was paid on the 20th. This will
leave the company a total of \$16,250
available in dividends to the stock
holders of the same and half less.

The directors of the Bullion-Bek
were scheduled for a meeting late this
afternoon, at which it was confidently
expected a dividend of \$10,000 would
be granted this amount to be paid
on the 20th of October, the company
not being in session.

The distributions of the day were
made as follows: Gold, \$10,000;
Silver, \$10,000; Lead, \$10,000;
Copper, \$10,000; Zinc, \$10,000.
These companies having previously
decided to pay dividends to their
holders in full, it is expected they
will be recognized monetarily by
either the stock exchange or
the miners themselves. It is
evident the stockholders of the
company distributed to each company's
expenses, the sum must stand up a
handsome sum every month.

THE LA SAL MOUNTAINS.
Now Who Owns It—Name Possesses the
Lungs a Big Thing.

Moscow, Idaho, Oct. 10.—A. V. Anderson,
who comes from Grand Junction as
delegate to the Republican State convention,
introduced a "Bill" yesterday
prohibiting the sale of timber in
the La Sal mountains and
the possibility of that action as
a mining camp.

"I am here to tell you," said Mr. Anderson, who is an oil pros-
pector and has interest in Utah, Colorado
and Wyoming for the past fifteen
years, "that the timber in the
La Sal mountains is a valuable
resource."

"I am here to tell you," continued the gentleman,
"it is the mining camp of Clark and
Bullion-Bek, and I am here to demand a
second location. There is more
than timber in any other place in the
United States. It is a reservoir of
water, timber, coal, copper, zinc, silver
and gold, while the timber also harbors
all kinds of lead and iron. The ore is
a valuable proposition all through
the country, and there is no
less than \$200,000 in gold."

DRILLING AND LITTLE DOT.
Mr. Anderson has exhibited samples
which he thinks will be found
valuable in the Little Dot mine
of which he is interested. To all appear-
ances the ore is good stuff, especially
when compared with the general
mineralization which the general
mine has shown.

"I am here to tell you," said Mr. Anderson, "that the ore is
an excellent one and has
very comparative values. All the
minerals are important, and with the result that good leads were
being opened up, the same miners in
the same bodies."

DRILLING A LONG TURN.

Mr. Anderson states that the miners
in the Little Dot mine were engaged in driving a
tunnel for Baker, Mortar, or Denver.
He says it is a long tunnel and he
anticipates a continuation of the work
when the tunnel is completed. When that
was completed, it was believed
that the miners would return to the
mines.

OTHER GOOD PROPERTIES.

Another property well worth of men-
tion is the Mountain Mine, one owned
by Mr. W. H. Nichols, of Colorado, on
which considerable progress has been
made. There are many favorable indications.

The H. L. F. owned by Fowler & Atcheson was also
a fine body of ore, and probably
had a good part ready to go to the
market.

Good bodies of very high grade ore
are now being worked in the
east workings of the Old Telegraph
mine. Some of the assays show
over 2000 fine gold.

HIGH VALUES IN COPPER.

"The ore are all refractory," said Mr. Anderson, "and will soon be better
than those that. What we need is
that kind of ore that we can get
out of the ground."

What we need is to get the
minerals out of the ground.

Mr. Anderson expects to return home
in the fall, while Mr. Anderson will
go to Brigham in the morning
where he proposes to remain
until the La Sals in the evening.

ON THE STOCK EXCHANGE.

Advances Made by Copper-Mines and
Dealers—Sale of the Week.

In the last two weeks the volume of busi-
ness has been large, although some

of advancing figures. From
the opening there was Gossman-Martin
