

PRESIDENT HORN ENTERS PROTEST

Objects to J. R. Walker's Action Against "Father" Gimlin.

OGDEN'S "ORATOR" TO PLAY

Horn Writes a Plain Letter to Baseball Park Manager—He is "Dumb-Founded and Non-Plussed."

It seems that J. R. Walker has a pretty big job on his hands in bawling Manager Gimlin of the Ogden team, from the local diamond for two games, as punishment for his unwise utterances in last Saturday's game. Manager Gimlin will be here tomorrow with his team, and if objection is made to his playing, he will call the team off and claim the game.

President E. G. Horn of the league has written the following rather pointed communication to Manager Walker, showing him just where he stands with reference to the league rules:

"I have your favor of the 14th instant, notifying me that you had suspended Manager Gimlin of the Ogden team, from participating in the next two games, and also requesting me to notify the officials of the Ogden team to this effect.

"In reply, I will say that I am somewhat surprised at the action sought to be taken by you, and at the same time am somewhat dumbfounded and non-plussed in my attempt to ascertain where you get your authority for any such action. I understand that the league is governed by a constitution and by-laws, and by the rules of the National League. Under these rules the umpire is the sole judge of all plays during the game, and is entirely responsible for the conduct of the players during such game, with power of suspension for violation of any rules. No one else is given authority, except managers, to punish players.

WALKER HAS NO AUTHORITY.

"When the different parks were leased for baseball purposes, there was no reservation or authority vested in the park manager by which he might sit in judgment upon the conduct of any of the umpires or players who might participate in games upon the grounds; and if this league would now permit you or any other manager to assume the power which you now attempt to assume, it must ultimately result in your not only passing judgment upon the players and umpires, but it would also permit you to sit in judgment upon the conduct of myself and the other officials of the league as well as the stockholders and backers of the different teams.

A PROPER MODE FOR PUNISHMENT.

"No one is more solicitous for the welfare of the game than myself, but I do not propose, as president of this league, to have everyone usurp such authority without entering my protest against the same. I do this in order to see that the game is conducted upon a proper and businesslike basis, and desire now, once and for all, to have it understood that myself and the other officials of the league are to be subjected to punishment or suspension, and that there is a proper mode of taking action, and unless the prescribed course is pursued, no punishment of any kind will be inflicted upon any one who is a member of the league.

"I notified the local officials of the contents of your letter, and they inform me that they do not desire to have any communication with you, for the reason that if any was addressed to them by you it would probably be of such a hostile nature, as to be entirely consumed before reaching you. They inform me that perhaps a suitable umpire would remedy the trouble. Hoping that this will be satisfactory to you, I am, very truly yours,

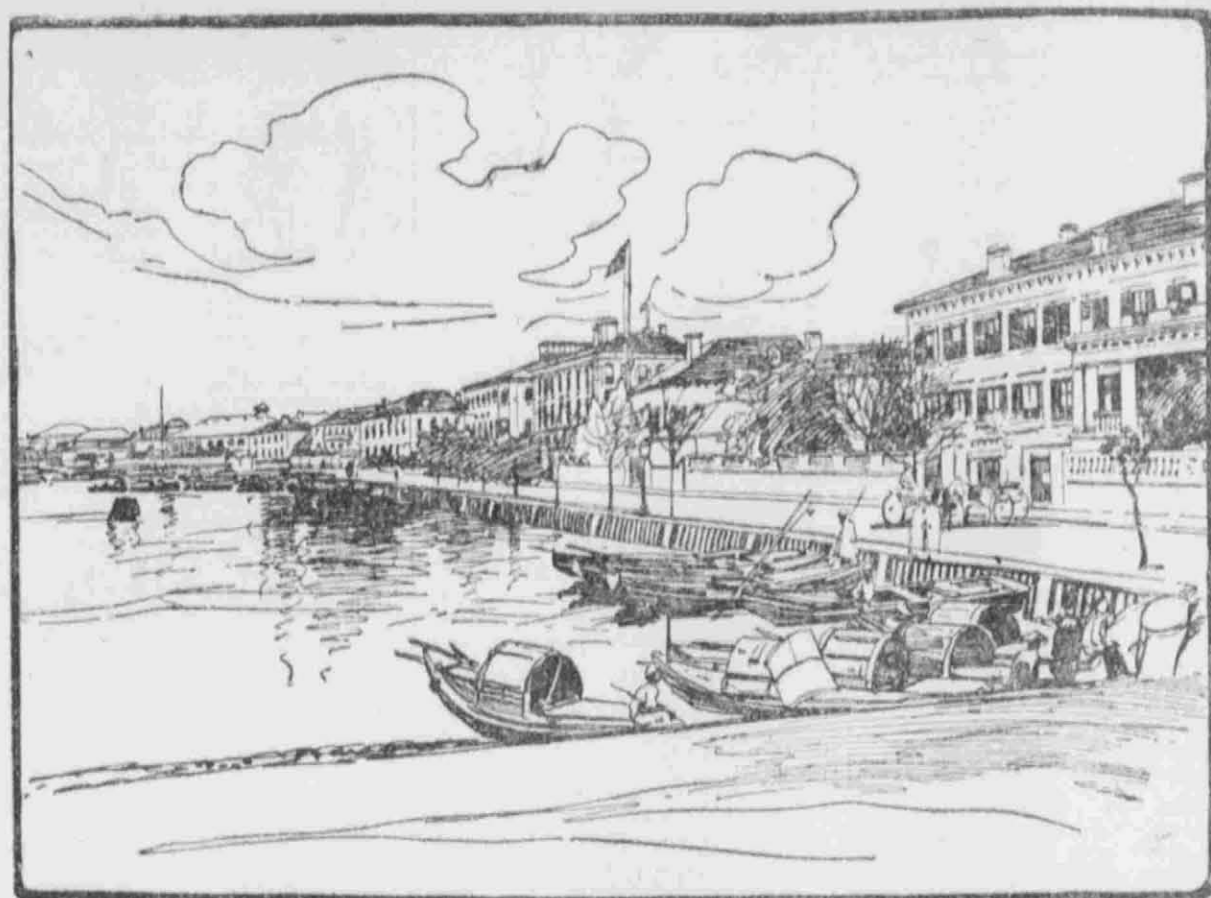

under the notice of the authorities since Dr. Ray was taken to the post house on December 13th. The number that has been passed upon by the quarantine physician up to the present time shows up to the total of 110, with four cases at present under treatment in the isolation hospital.

The report shows that up to the first of August out of the 106 cases reported, 24 had been vaccinated, while 52 patients had not been inoculated with virus.

BISHOP FOWLER'S LECTURE.

The Greatest of Presidents Eulogized by the Distinguished Churchman.

The audience that filled the First M. E. church last evening to hear Bishop Fowler lecture on "Abraham Lincoln," went with the expectation of hearing something great, and they heard it.

For two hours and a half the people sat like they were riveted to the seats, and the tendency to weariness was dissipated by the relating of one of Lincoln's Christian stories, or a dramatic and graphic description of a feature of the great crisis through which Lincoln guided the nation. The lecture was replete with humor, pathos, anecdote and philosophy which ennobled the hearts and minds of those who heard it.

The lecturer was introduced by Rev. Joel A. Smith in a few words, and he began by describing the environments of Lincoln as a child, and as a young man.

He was born in the poorest poverty, and his clothes were adapted more to the customs of the frontier than to his personal architecture. With keen analytical powers the speaker entered into the conditions of the country, social, political and religious at the time when Lincoln entered public life. Bishop Fowler stated that Lincoln was the best Christian he had ever encountered in public life, and the most magnanimous man he had ever known. He was patient under personal insult, prudent in council, but above all other men he was possessed of that most uncommon thing among men—common sense.

To illustrate his patience the speaker related a few instances in which the President endured personal insult from Gen. George B. McClellan, who when the President called on him one night the general sent back word to tell the President that he had gone to bed. If you would like to know what I would have done," said the speaker, "Come up and ask me privately," but Lincoln bore it. Some time later General McClellan sent a dispatch to the President conveying the thrilling intelligence that he had captured seven eels and he wanted to know what he should do with them. The President wired back "euck, em." Abraham Lincoln was the President, though he had much of iron around him, he was a man of chilled steel and they had to bend.

And then the speaker presented every phase of the great man's character, who he said, had the faith of Abraham, the statesmanship of Pericles, the intelligence of Paul, the integrity of Cromwell and the patriotism of Washington.

As a stump speaker the world has never seen his equal, he could put an extinguisher on an opponent in thirty seconds. As an orator he will rank with the greatest of the earth. "Who was ever before him, and, said the speaker, "when I join the great majority and peer into the throne and see the tall form of Abraham Lincoln, I will be content for I will know that I have found the right place."
