Dickens in early life was enamored of the stake. Thorwaldsen, the great Danish sculptor, after working for months unrecognized in Rome, determined, in despair, to return home and lay down the sculptor, schnsel forever. A chance error by a careless clerk in drawing his passport detained him twenty four hours. During that interval of walting Mr. Hope walked into his studio, admired his Jason in clay, and aroused the despondent Dane's hopes by ordering a copy in marble. Thorwaldsen unpacked his boxes, and never afterward in his long career lacked patronage. Rachael, the great tragedienne, was when a child a street singer, and as such might have passed into womanhood and old age had not a party of critics dining together chanced to hear her clear loud voice beneath their windows. They observed the child's wonderful face and eyes, and in a kindly spirit, aroused no doubt by the wine they had drunk, proposed to her productors to place her in the conservatory as a pupil. Sir Walter Raleigh would probably have remained out of favor with the court had Elizabeth, on her walk to the tower chanced to take a path less muddy. Every reader of history knows the story, how the gallant Sir Walter spread his cloak beneath the royal feet, and was rewarded with his sovereign's smile and speedy restoration to favor. Potemkin, the favorite of Catharine H and the founder of the powerful Russian family which bears his name, would doubtless have remained an obscure-soldier had not a trivial incident, a chance, in fact, changed his destiny.

After Catharine had deposed her weak husband and herself assumed the sceptre, she was accustomed to parade the streets of St. Petersburg at the head of her troops. One day Pot mkin noticed her sword bore no knot. He boldly

fered his. The czarina accepted it, and struck by the handsomie young lieutenant, asked his name and regiment and if he would not like to serve here in the palace. Halii Pasha, the sultar's chief of artillery and most trusted adviser, was a tinner. Employed in the palace he offered to mend a valuable French clock, as ac clockmaker was available, and did the work so well the sultan bade him lay aside his tinner's furnace and serve him. Sir Robert Wilson, one of England's best generals, owed his clevation from a desk in a solicitor's office to a chance meeting with the Duke of York in the rain. Of Benjamin Disraeli there was a story current years ago to prove the building of his greatness was neiped along by chance. In his youth he was a reckless spendthrift. His ambition was to lead his party, but such was the state of his finances that at one time it was doubtful whether he could longer support the expense of a seat in Parliament. Accident or chance threw him in the way of a noted money lender in London, who liked the brilliant young dandy on first sight, and did what he had never done before nor afterward to any man, lent Disraeli £5,000 on no other security than his genius and ambition. Disraeli never forgot the service, and never tired, so the story goes, of returning it in the various ways which his after influence enabled him to do.

George Stephenson, the inventor of the locomotive, was born with a taste for mechanics. His parents were too wretchedly poor to give him the advantages of education. At a very tender age he was compelled to work as a pit boy at twopence a day, to help support the family. Deep in the mines, shut out from everything that cheered the senses, young Stephenson found much to stimulate his mechanical bent. He mastered the hoisting machinery, and longed to be in charge of it. One day the engineer chanced to stumble and injure himself. Young Stephenson promptly offered to supply his place, and provad his skill so well that the
