THE LATEST FROM MASSOWAH.

THE BLOCKADE.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 16.—The snow
blockade on the Central Pacific, which
it was expected would be raised this
morning, continues. No mail has
been received here from the east
for three days. The blockade would
have been raised had it not been for
the collapse of the snowdrifts between
Coffey and Blue Canyon last night,
which permitted the snow to settle
late at a new place. It also caused the
wreck of a snowplow and the derail-
ment of eight engines which were en-
gaged in clearing the track. No one
was seriously hurt by the accident. A
wrecking train was sent to the scene
and Sup. Filmore expresses the opin-
ion that business will be resumed dur-
ing the night among the snowbound
passengers going eastward are J. W.
Mackay, en route for Virginia City,
and the Louisville Base Ball Club.

THE CORING STORM.

It will not be held back long.

STANBURY, Feb. 16.—Prince Hohen-
lohe, governor of Alsace-Lorraine, is
an election manifesto in which he
says:

"I desire to address the people of
Alsace-Lorraine a few well-meant
words of counsel. The Government
asked for the passage of the septen-
nary army bill because it is persuaded
that Germany will be threatened with
danger of war soon, as that part of the
French nation which longs for war re-
gards the military strength of France
superior to that of Germany. If Al-
sace-Lorraine wishes to be exposed to
the terrors of the war."

ANOTHER WAR.

let peaceable, conciliatory deputies be
elected to the new Reichstag—deputies
who accept the peace of 1871. Those
who vote to return members of the
protestant (anti-German) party are
enemies of the Government. The
members of the septenary bill will be
responsible for the continuance of dis-
quiet and the resultant injury to trade
and commerce. If in some electoral
districts the friends of peace and
themselves unable to become members
may deposit blank voting papers, and
in that way express their views, and
record the real opinions of the popu-
lary. The union of Alsace-Lorraine to
Germany is servitude as long as the
German Empire is a reality. The
good and evil of the septenary bill
love of home, family and property dic-
tates."

BECOMING SERIOUS.

BERLIN, Feb. 16.—Nachrichten says:
The threatening character of the situa-
tion across the western frontier is be-
coming more acute. In view of
the fact that four hundred men have
been constructed to shelter 100,000 men,
preparations have been made to shel-
ter a similar number around Belfort.
We have, beyond doubt, to deal with
nothing less than the strengthening of
the French line to enable them at the
beginning of hostilities to throw a
strong force across the river, and thus
transfer the operations to German
territory.

Herr Tiesdorff, chief prosecutor of the
imperial tribunal at Leipzig, Com-
missioner Tausch, of the criminal in-
quiry department and Federal Prose-
cutor Vacano, held a conference at
Strasbourg to-day. Herr Tiesdorff
afterward started for Mulhausen and
Herr Tausch for Metz.

THE COMMERCE LAW.

CHICAGO, Feb. 16.—The fact was
made evident to-day that it is not to
be at all smooth sailing with the west-
ern railroads in getting into line with
the inter-state commerce law.
Through rates on the Southwestern
Association lines have always been
held up to a high point, and the local
rates as a whole kept in harmony so
that the south-western road could
readily accommodate their traffic to
the east. But it was found that the
general meeting of the agents of the
lines running to Kansas City, Council
Bluffs and St. Paul, it was found that
the case was quite different with the
two latter. This was especially seen
in the fact that the local rates on the
Kansas City road, which are much in
excess of the through rates and must
be advanced if the recent revenue of the
road is to be preserved. To do this the
Council Bluffs road would have to
advance its rates through rates. Serious
difference of opinion at once arose. The
Kansas City business, respectfully de-
clined to pull their neighbors' chest-
nuts out of the fire. The most gen-
eral opinion among officials to-night is
that the result will be that each of the
three associations west of Chicago
will be forced to interpret the law in-
dependent of the others.
