

TELEGRAPHIC, CUBAN REBELLION.

General Cervera Thinks It Will Be
Crushed Before Spring.

THOUSAND TROOPS DEBARRED.

Army Camps Not to Commence
Until Next—Victims of
the Fever.

LIMA, Aug. 14.—The Havana correspondent of the *Times* telegraphed to-day that all Cuban forces had been sent back to their posts. Captain General Martínez de Cárdenas has received delegations from all political parties. His personal popularity makes everybody glad to see him. Addressing the returnees he said that the revolution would probably develop further before the Bush administration's arrival. He said it was his intention to begin a heavy campaign in September against the insurgents in the northern provinces. The Cuban Army has been sent to the interior of the country, but the feeling against increasing the garrison will prevent such a course. The president has promised to grant additional supplies should he be absolutely free, and that he would probably meet any case of emergency.

In the course of a private conversation Madrid's宰相 expressed the opinion that intervention would be necessary to restore the government and the army. The government would be unable to agree, but there is no doubt now that Madrid has made up his mind to do what he said he would do. His two brothers are open to the idea, and lately those in the United States have been urging him to grant independence.

The report of the Alcade of Madrid has joined the revolutionists in secret. An average number of deaths have been reported during the insurrection, but since the beginning of the rebellion no week has been less than 100.
