At a weekly meeting of the Land League to-day, Michael Davitt stated that the executive of the League proposed to issue suggestions to the organizations of the League throughout the country embodying their opinion upon the outrages.

As Premier Bratiano, of Roumania, was entering his carriage to-day an employee of the finance department rushed upon him with a poignard and inflicted a slight wound in the face. Deputies came to the assistance of Bratiano and handed over the would-be assassin to the police.

ST. LOUIS CONFERENCE.

The St. Louis Conference was held on the 7th of November, 1880, in Broadway Hall, No. 1310 Broadway.

Alfred Paterson was set apart to the office and calling of a teacher under the hands of Elder Matthias Cowley.

The sacrament was administered. The St. Louis branch has 4 elders, 1 teacher and 24 members; 3 have been baptized since last May conference; present total, 29.

Conference was brought to a close by singing and benediction by Prest. Andrew Burman.

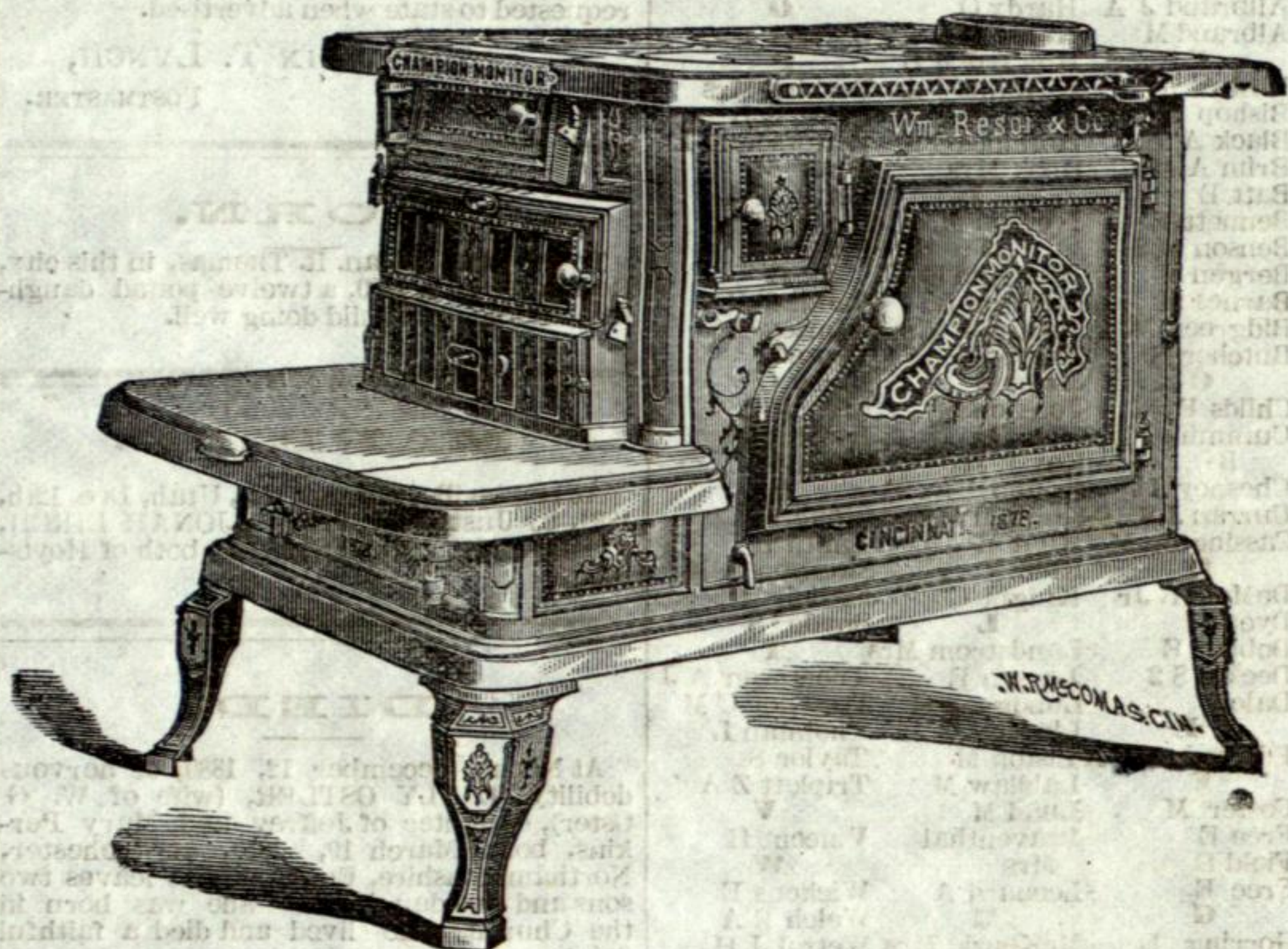
