

Ameer to quell the revolt and publicly received the thanks of the British officers for his pretended efforts to assist Cavagnari.

A Paris dispatch says: An official decree pardons 150 communists, also that last night's vote in the chamber of deputies on the order of the day, which was accepted by the cabinet, was 255 to 57, showing that the government was not supported by a majority of the full house. Hence the vote does not strengthen the position of the cabinet.

It is affirmed that Waddington addressed a circular to the Powers containing the suggestion of collective mediation on the Greek question.

PANAMA, 6.—Advices from Lima November 25th, bring intelligence of an important battle, November 15th, at a place called San Francisco. The allied Peruvians and Bolivians under Buerder, numbering about 12,000, attacked the invading army of Chilians in a strongly entrenched position. The allies were defeated with a loss of 3,000, the ardor of the Bolivians cooling and discontent rapidly spreading. The Chilian frigate *Blanco Encalada* captured the Peruvian gunboat *Pelcomayo*. The outlook for the Peruvians is anything but favorable.

Government has issued a decree ordering all silver mined in the country to be subject to purchase by the government at a fixed rate in paper. An export duty on sugar has also been decreed. The state of affairs in Lima is not satisfactory and a dictatorship is freely spoken of. The names of La Coteria and Pierrola are freely mentioned therein.

#### HOW TO GATHER AND PEEL BASKET WILLOW.

To Gather.—Do not look for it on the low flats of Jordan and Salt Lake, and on low flat places where it is smothered with weeds and shaded by brush; for there it is generally brittle and worthless. It is plentiful and usually good where fire or the ax has a year previous destroyed a heavy growth, in the cañons or beside cañon streams in the valleys. It also follows the farmer's efforts to destroy it. If you have some, gather and peel it. Women and children can do it, and it takes but a small bundle of white willow to buy a hat or shoes, and it is marketable the whole year. If the first lot prove defective you will learn thereby how to do next time, but if these instructions are carefully followed, there will be no failure. They will fetch from five to fifteen cents per pound, according to size, quality and time of marketing.

The best varieties are the "black" and "gray"—those having a wide leaf, growing in clumps, etc., not the running sort. Yet good shoots are sometimes found on every kind. Toughness is an indispensable requirement. Shoots are required of all lengths, from two to eight feet long, and should be cut close to the stump or ground, to secure the best part of the willow and the heaviest. Straight, clean shoots of one year's growth, which can be knuckled over without breaking. Cannot use "brush." Two year old stalks that are tough and running free of brush, a length of three feet or more, are sometimes used.

To Peel.—They are ready in April or May. When the bud swells and the leaf forms as "large as a mouse's ears," they must be cut, and not allowed to wilt before peeling, but may, if necessary, be kept a few days by setting the butts in water. Some kinds are ready sooner than others, but when ready they must be cut, as in a short time they are leafed out fully, and become yellow and brittle. A stripper is made by splitting half way down a piece of hard wood two feet long and two inches thick, and then whittling into the cleft so as to make two edges or corners meet. The green willow drawn through this cleft is separated from the bark, which can then be removed by the fingers; it is then laid out in the sun to dry, kept out of the rain, and when quite dry, tied together in bundles. Now, beginners are apt to pinch them too hard in the brake or stripper, and thus crush and spoil them. This must always be carefully avoided, even by experienced persons. It will require about four hundred pounds of green willow to make one hundred of white.

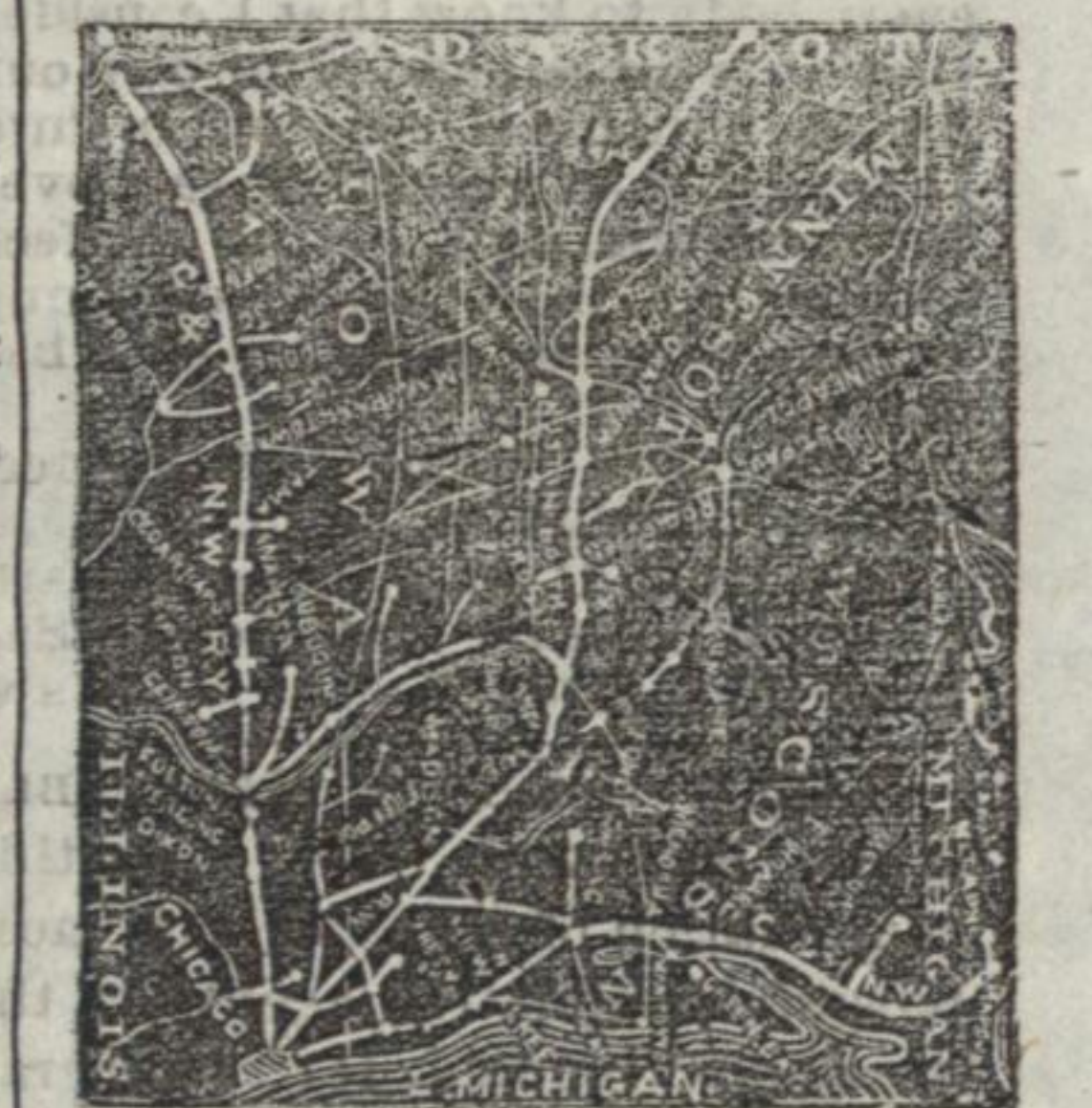
