

## SAN DOMINGO IS BARRICADED.

This Time It Is Against the Forces Of the New Provisional Government.

### AMERICAN LEGATION MOVED.

Many Arrests Made—Situation Serious—Three Revolutions Rage On the Island.

San Domingo, Republic of Santo Domingo, Dec. 29.—The city of San Domingo is again barricaded, this time against the forces of the new provisional government founded at Azua de Compostella by Gen. Pelletier, who are marching on the capital. The financial position of the Morales government is bad. The officials find it difficult to obtain rations for the soldiers.

The American minister, Mr. Powell who has been living in the suburbs, has been compelled to move the legation inside the city boundaries. President Morales returned here last night. He found it impossible to land on the northern part of the island, but bombarded Puerto Plata. The damage done is not known. Morales is taking all possible steps to defend San Domingo.

Many arrests have been made. The situation is complicated and serious. The government troops are preparing to leave here and attack the rebels at San Cristobal, two hours distant from here. Much excitement prevails at this place. The arrival of the American warship to reinforce the gunboat Newport is anxiously desired.

The Cuban steamer which touched San Juan, via Puerto Plata, Santo Domingo, has ceased to call at San Juan, thus severing that line of communication of Gen. Wos y Gil former president of Santo Domingo, with the seat of war in that republic. The Gil party openly announces that they will sail for Santo Domingo Jan. 6 to co-operate with Gen. Jimenez. The gathering of war munitions continues in Porto Rico. Gov. Huan still refuses to recognize the Morales consulate at San Juan, which has appealed to the French consul to prevent the sailing of Gen. Wos y Gil for Santo Domingo on a French steamer.

A Washington dispatch says: With three revolutions raging on the island, the forces of Jimenez within four hours of San Domingo City and excitement prevailing, Minister Powell thinks the situation demands the presence of an additional warship, and in a cablegram dated yesterday appeals to the state department for aid. In anticipation of the crisis, which appears to have arrived, the state department had already taken steps to send another warship to San Domingo, and at its request Secy. Moody yesterday called Rear Admiral Lambertson, commanding the South Atlantic squadron, now at Trinidad, to dispatch one of his vessels to San Domingo at full speed to assist the gunboat Newport in protecting American and other interests.

Later advices say the insurgents are attacking the city, which is being defended by the troops of the provisional government, which are now fighting in force. The Clyde line steamer Cherone has arrived in port.

The government authorities demanded that that portion of the Cherokee's cargo destined for Azua de Compostella be discharged here. This demand was resisted by the state department agents, who notified the government that the Cherokee would proceed to Azua de Compostella. In case of aggression on the part of the government authorities, the steamer agent will ask United States Minister Powell for protection.

A commission from San Pedro de Macoris, which is declared in favor of the insurgents, arrived here today, and is demanding the surrender of San Domingo to the insurgent forces.

Gen. Morales, the provisional president, is determined to resist to the limit all attacks by the insurgents. He left last night on the Dominican gunboat Independencia with the intention of attacking the insurgents in ports to the south.

## BEDS AND TENTS FOR THE STRIKERS.

Miners' Union Buy Many for the Evicted Families of the Coal Country.

### OFFICIAL INSPECTION NOW ON.

Coal Mine Inspector Thomas Visiting Sunnyside, Castle Gate, Winter Quarters and Clear Creek.

The Carbon county strikers have bought quantities of bedding for use in the tents being furnished by the Miners' union, one Salt Lake firm alone selling \$4,000 worth, to be distributed among all the camps in the county. The purchases include iron bedsteads, mattresses, blankets, quilts and pillows. With all this living equipment, the strikers propose to go into camp and make a moral impression. Tents were sent from Price yesterday, to Sunnyside for 45 families who will be cared for by the union. The tents are to live in them with any degree of comfort is hard to imagine. The company is doing at Sunnyside 65 per cent of its normal business.

**THOMAS AT SUNNYSIDE.**  
Coal Mine Inspector Gomer Thomas inspected the Sunnyside mines yesterday, and found things satisfactory. Today, he is inspecting the Castle Gate mines, and tomorrow will move on to Clear Creek and Winter Quarters. He is seeing that the diggers, many of whom are practically green hands, are protected as to life and limb.

**RATE IS LOWEST.**  
The one cent a mile rate offered by the D. & R. G. out of Carbon county, is the lowest rate ever offered by a railroad west of the Missouri river, and the railway officials believe it will result in materially thinning out the camps of the strikers.

**DON'T LIKE POTTER.**  
Chief Deputy Noah Potter of the guards at Winter Quarters is persona non grata with the military, owing, it is claimed, to his actions which may cause a riot at any time. Maj. Heywood, commanding the troops at Clear Creek, has protested to Gen. Cannon against the conduct of the company guards at Sunday's riot, and insists that Potter be removed. Gen. Cannon has notified the company that unless this is done, Potter will be arrested and disarmed by the troops and turned over to the civil authorities.

### KILLING OF CHINESE COOK.

Results in Wade Being Held for Murder in First Degree.

Murder in the first degree is the charge which J. H. Wade will have to face in the district court for the killing of a Chinese cook, named Lee Yon, at the Alt-Quincy mine at Alta on Saturday, Dec. 19. Wade's preliminary hearing was commenced before Justice Burrows at Sandy on Monday and was concluded yesterday when he was held to the district court on the above charge. County Attorney Westervelt conducted the preliminary hearing. Three witnesses were examined for the state and four for the defense.

The evidence at the hearing did not show that it was a clear case of self-defense which prompted the killing, and facts came out which put a different light on the matter from the story first told by Wade and his friends. When the crime was committed it was stated that the Chinaman was pursuing Wade with a big 18-inch butcher knife when the latter fired the fatal shot. It developed at the preliminary hearing that Wade had been tormenting the Chinaman for some time and when the latter became involved in a quarrel with Olsen at the dinner table and drew the knife on him Wade deliberately went into the bunk room and secured his revolver. When he returned the Chinaman was standing at the kitchen door with the knife in his hand and Wade fired at him.

It is the opinion of County Attorney Westervelt that the friends of Wade are attempting to frame up a story which will clear him. The officials are of the opinion, however, that they have a strong case of deliberate murder against Wade. The defendant is in the county jail awaiting trial.

## MISSIONARIES ARE MASSACRED.

John G. Tate and a Party of Eighteen Murdered in Depths Of an African Forest.

### NATIVES FEARED WHITE MEN.

Had They Not Killed Him Now, He Would Have Brought His Country to Take Them.

Washington, Dec. 29.—Minister Lyon has reported to the state department from Monrovia, Liberia, under date of Nov. 4 last, the details of the massacre in the depths of an African forest of a white missionary named John G. Tate, with all of his following, eighteen in number. It appears that the massacre took place as far back as March 15, 1901, yet this, the first detailed account, has just come to hand in an affidavit by Mrs. Mary L. Allen, a white missionary at Monrovia, Liberia. She had the story from some of the native Doo tribesmen, who knew of the killing.

Tate had a large mission and farm, and besides he maintained a considerable school in the jungle and altogether nineteen people were in the mission when it was surrounded in the night by the Dooes. The first man who answered a knock at the door was shot. Tate appeared and tried to protect the body of the interpreter, he, too, was shot and cut to pieces.

The Dooes then killed all the remaining inmates of the house, cut off their hands, and placing the bloody members in a coffin sent them back to their people as trophies. In explanation of their action the Dooes said:

"We have no fight with the white man, but if we do not kill him now, he will bring his country to make war upon us."

### Mary Anderson on the Stage Again

New York, Dec. 30.—For the first time since her retirement, nearly 15 years ago, Mary Anderson (Madame de Narbonne), the famous American actress, has reappeared on the stage, says a Herald dispatch from London.

The event took place at the People's palace, in the east end of London, where the entertainment given by the Rev. Father Bernard Vaughan for the poor, sick and suffering, among whom he labors, she sang several songs and read a balcony scene from "Romeo and Juliet."

### Archbp. Farley Invited to Rome.

New York, Dec. 30.—Archbishop Farley of this city has received an invitation to visit Rome to attend the celebration of the jubilee of the immaculate conception, and probably will sail early next month.

Three important church questions are likely to be brought to an issue while the archbishop is in Rome. They are the supposed need for foreign missionaries, especially for the Italians, selection of a coadjutor bishop for this diocese, and the placing of the American church in direct communication with the vatican by establishing canon law here and removing the restrictions provided for this as a missionary country.

### Albuquerque Hotel Burned.

Albuquerque, N. M., Dec. 30.—The Highland hotel, one of the finest winter resorts in New Mexico, has been totally destroyed by fire. Defective wiring of the oil bell board in the hotel office caused the cause of the fire. Several invalids at the hotel had narrow escapes, but there were no casualties. The loss is \$60,000, with \$25,000 insurance. The guests lost practically all their clothing and personal effects.

### John Charlton Very Ill.

Toronto, Ont., Dec. 30.—John Charlton, who recently delivered addresses in many cities of the United States in favor of reciprocity with the Dominion, is critically ill at his home in Lynedoch. Owing to advanced age there are fears for his life.

### Will Subpoena the President.

Binghamton, N. Y., Dec. 30.—It is understood that President Roosevelt, Senator C. Platt and J. Pierpont Morgan and other prominent men will be subpoenaed as witnesses for the trial of the action of A. D. Wales of Scotland.

### A NEW CANCER CURE.

A Remarkable One Effected with Radium.

New York, Dec. 30.—Radium is reported to have removed a cancer which had spread over the entire right cheek of William Hoffman, 62 years old, of Newark, N. J. When he came here for treatment several specialists expressed the belief that the growth could be removed only by cutting away nearly all the flesh on one side of his head.

Hoffman's nephew, a physician, procured a tube containing a tiny portion of radium and experimented by placing it in the patient's mouth. He reports that Hoffman complained of a burning sensation in the cheek, which became unendurable after about 40 minutes. The swelling began to go down immediately and the growth began to disappear after the treatment had been continued a few days. A stronger tube was procured from Paris, and at the end of six weeks the cancer is said to have entirely disappeared, leaving the cheek in its normal state.

### Employees Laid Off.

Chicago, Dec. 30.—On account of the closing of the Illinois Steel company's mill at South Chicago, 500 employees of the Chicago, Lake Shore & Eastern railway, which is operated by the Steel company, have been laid off, and 180 more discharged. Among the men discharged were 30 of the oldest employees of the company, mostly engineers. All have been employed by the road from 15 to 20 years.

Upon inquiry the men were told that the company must cut down expenses.

### Royal Cooper Villas Dead.

Chicago, Dec. 30.—Royal Cooper Villas, president of the Erie National Electric Light company, is dead at his residence here, aged 61 years.

Mr. Villas was born in Ogdensburg, N. Y. His boyhood was spent in Ogdensburg, and until seven years ago, when he came to Chicago, he lived in

New York city, holding the position of general freight traffic manager of the Erie railroad. He was also at one time president of the New York Air Brake company of New York city.

Mrs. Villas, four sons and two daughters survive him. They are Royal C. Villas, Jr., Logan A. Villas, Lawrence S. Villas and Ward A. Villas of Chicago; Mrs. Elsie Hayden, New York city; Miss Eleanor Villas, Chicago.

The Ogdensburg club of Lake Forest, the Pasadena Country club, Pasadena, Cal.; the Racquet & Tennis club of New York city, and the St. Lawrence Yacht club are some of the clubs with which Mr. Villas was connected.

### Want Vanderbilt for Colonel.

New York, Dec. 30.—Alfred Wynne Vanderbilt has been asked by the famous Newport artillery, the oldest chartered military company in the United States, to become its colonel, says a dispatch to the Press from Newport, R. I. It is understood he will accept. The company, although not so old in actual organization as the Ancient and Honorable Artillery company of Boston, antedates its charter.
