

WILL SUE THE SWANSEA

Stockholders of the Company Taking Steps in That Direction.

AGAINST OFFICIALS' HIGH SALARIES.

On the Exchange Today—Shareholders a Divided and Nervous Body.

It was currently reported in mining circles today that suit was about to be brought against the Swansea Mining company by stockholders therein, to compel the payment by the directors of the salaries of the company, of what is termed by the aggrieved ones, "such important monthly salaries" as it is their right to receive. It is understood that Attorney General Sullivan had not been retained as counsel for the plaintiffs, and that a restraining order will be asked for in a day or two. The suit is the result of a meeting of stockholders held very much dissatisfied with the high salaries paid the company's officials, and their argument is that if a more economical official had been in charge, the same salaries would have been paid. The directors of the company would not be held liable for their salaries, they contend that their salaries are in fact a loan to the company, and that the company is not liable for them.
