Seven deaths from yellow fever in the past week.

Los Ayres has been declared by the Senate to be the capital of the Republic.

Garfield invincibles paraded the streets of San Francisco by night last night.

Over a thousand six hundred and four immigrants arrived in New York last week.

General Grant informed a reporter that he would remain east until going to Galena only to vote.

New York Herald's Washburn special concludes that Clifford will not resume his seat in the Supreme Court.

News comes by way of Constantinople of a great insurrection of the medians in Kashgar, against the Chinese.

Porte resolved to cede Duligno to the urgent representation by the French and German ambassadors.

Body of Patrick Virivin, killed in the Hudson disaster, was recovered this morning, three more bodies in view.

Evening George Salisbury stabbed his brother-in-law, Briggs, during a quarrel at New York, N. Y.

Baltimore's celebration of her centenary 150 years ago, began today and the streets presented a brilliant spectacle.

The National Board of Health reports the recent report of the Interior, stating that yellow fever has been on the lower Mississippi.
