Commissioner Norrell rendered a decision in the suit of Springer vs. Bamberger, this morning, giving judgment in favor of the defendant. Mr. Bamberger bought a city lot near the Salt Lake brewery. Mr. Springer had one adjoining it on the back, and conceived the idea of getting the lot and opening a street through the block. He offered \$1,000 for it—\$300 more than Mr. Bamberger paid—and the offer was accepted. For the option he gave \$25, with the understanding that he was to receive an abstract as soon as it could properly be prepared. He learned that Mr. Bamberger had procured the abstract and asked for it two or three times, receiving the reply that it was not quite ready, but would be in a day or two. The defendant then instituted suit for the recovery of the \$25. When the case was tried yesterday, these facts came out, as did, also, Mr. Bamberger's reason for not surrendering the abstract. The title to the property was not perfect, and Mr. Bamberger had retained the abstract until everything was straightened out, when he offered it to Mr. Springer, who would not then accept it, but demanded his "option" money. The court decided that Mr. Springer was in the right, and that Mr. Bamberger must either forfeit his \$25, or take the property at the price he offered originally.

Robbery at Elko.

Night before last Wells, Fargo & Co's office at Elko was entered and a treasury box containing \$400, which was awaiting shipment to Teacucora, stolen. The robbers effected an entrance into the express office by breaking through a glass door. There were two treasury boxes in the office, one containing \$600 in gold and the other \$2000 in gold and as much more in silver. The robbers took the heaviest box—that containing gold—put it on a wheelbarrow and wheeled it out in the night. They then carried the box some distance and for some cause left it, and it was found in the morning abandoned. The money was being sent to Teacucora to pay the employees of mining companies.—*Nevada Silver State, May 16.*
