U.S. BASKETBALL LEAGUE BY LAWS.

Schedule of Games Will Probably Be Decided Upon Next Saturday.

OFFICERS FOR THIS YEAR.

George Taylor and O. L. Cox are Chosen as Official Referees for the Organization.

Next Saturday afternoon there will be a meeting of the officers of the recently organized U. S. Basketball League for the purpose of deciding upon the schedule for the coming season.

Today the "News" is able to publish the by-laws of the new league. The names of the officers and the official referees are also given. They follow:

THE LEAGUE OFFICERS.
President, John A. Giddens, B. Y. C. vice president, Clyde Lundberg, B. Y. C. secretary and treasurer, R. J. Evans, B. Y. C.

Official referees, George Taylor and O. L. Cox, both of Salt Lake City.

BY-LAWS OF THE LEAGUE.
The organization shall be known as the Utah Basketball League.

The league shall be governed by an executive committee.

This executive committee shall consist of representatives from each school in the league.

The officers of the league shall be: President, vice president, secretary and treasurer.

These officers shall be elected by the executive committee at a meeting to be held within 30 days after season closes.

The duties of these officers shall be the same as those ordinarily performed by such officers.

DUTIES OF PRESIDENT.
The president shall notify the members of the executive committee of the annual meeting at least 10 days in advance.

It shall be the duty of the president to settle disputes between competing schools and in case the president cannot settle same satisfactorily to both schools to refer the matter to the executive committee.

The members of this committee shall be chosen from the schools not brought into dispute; each competing team shall choose one man and the two chosen shall choose the third. The decision of this committee shall be final.

AS TO DISPUTES.
In case of a dispute being carried to the committee of last resort, the expense of suit committed shall be borne equally by the two contending schools.

An annual fee of \$2.00 shall be paid by each team on entering the league.

The legitimate expenses of the officers of the league shall be paid out of the treasury.

Membership in this league shall be contingent upon payment of fee.

A team which is unable to play a game as per schedule shall forfeit its right to play that game.

Any team failing to complete the schedule without the consent of the executive committee, shall be disqualified from further participation in the league.

No team of this league shall play any outside team of the state during the period which this schedule carries in effect.

The members of the executive committee through the president.

No man shall represent any team in this league who is not a bona fide student of the school he represents, in satisfactory standing, and who is not carrying 12 hours of regular work.

Regular work will be construed to mean work towards graduation.

No student shall be allowed to take part in any game who has played on any school team for four years.

No student entering school after Jan. 15 of each year shall be allowed to take part in the league games.

TO GIVE LIST OF PLAYERS.
The manager of each team shall present to the manager of the opposing team, before the game, a list of all his men who are eligible to participate in the game.
