

BREVITIES.

The French government has ordered 100,000 Remington rifles from the United States.

A Norwegian has settled in Ohio who is seven feet four inches high, and weighs 322 pounds.

The freshets in the New England rivers that rise in the mountain districts, have been of longer duration this spring than for the last forty years.

The pig-iron product of Great Britain in 1868 was 4,800,000 tons; of the United States, 1,603,000. Pennsylvania furnishing 825,555 tons of this amount.

The late Chief Justice Williams, of New Bedford, Massachusetts, retired from the bench at the age of 65 without a dollar in property, having lost his fortune by the failure of others. He also owed \$5,000. He went to work in profession, paid his debts, and retired with a competence at the age of 76.

Mr. Parker of London, has just made a lens, three feet in diameter, three inches thick in the center, and weighing two hundred and twelve pounds. In the focus of this powerful lens the most refractory metals are almost instantly fused and dissipated in vapor, while unyielding stony substances are as readily vitrified.

In making an excavation at St. Joseph Mo., the other day, the workmen came upon a brick wall fifteen feet below the surface of the ground. The "oldest inhabitant" has no recollection of any house ever having been built at that place, and says there were no bricks in the country until many years after he settled in St. Joseph.

Josh Billings was asked, "How fast does sound travel?" and his idea is that it depends on a good deal upon the noise you are talking about. "The sound of a dinner-horn, for instance, travels half a mile in a second, while an invitation to get up in the morning I have known to be 3 quarters of an hour going up 2 pair of stairs, and then not having strength left to be heard."

A correspondent gives us an account of an ingeniously extemporized apparatus for removing carbonic acid from wells. It was simply an umbrella let down and rapidly hauled up a number of times in succession. The effect was to remove the gas in a few minutes from a well so foul as to instantly extinguish a candle previous to the use of the umbrella. —Scientific American.

The British aristocracy have large families. The Marquis of Anglesey is one of eighteen brothers and sisters; the Marquis of Huntley, of fourteen; Earl Fitzwilliam is one of thirteen, and has thirteen children of his own; Earl Grey is one of fifteen, the late Lord Denham left fifteen; the Duke of Argyll has twelve; the Duke of Leinster is one of thirteen, the father of the Duke of Buccleuch left eleven children; the Earl of Minto left fourteen; the Earl of Bessborough has fourteen.

A few days ago, in Galena, Ill., six little boys, all under 12 years of age, were poisoned by eating wild parsnips. One of the boys, who had eaten more than the others, became dizzy, and fell into the river, but was rescued from drowning by some men at work near by. When brought out of the water he went into convulsions and died in about half an hour, none but his companions knowing that he had eaten the parsnips. The other boys all sickened shortly after, but prompt medical attendance saved them.

A convict at the Joliet, Ill., Penitentiary made a novel attempt to escape a few days ago. The day previous a colored convict died, and when they were taking the coffin to the burial ground the officers perceived a slight movement of the coffin lid, which had not been screwed down. Upon opening the coffin a live white man was found. He was secured and returned to prison.

The olive of the Gulf States is a low branching, evergreen tree, which attains a height of twenty or thirty feet. The ordinary crop is from fifteen to twenty pounds of the fruit annually, and this yield is subject to none of the casualties of other products. It begins to bear at six years of age. It grows equally well in limestone, in clay or in alluvial regions, and it requires but little pruning or care. It is propagated by seed, by cuttings and by means of cortical tumors, which form upon the trunk and are excised and planted like bulbs.

We find the following excellent table in the Ottawa (Illinois) Statesman, which farmers will do well to paste in a scrap book for future reference: 5 yards wide by 968 yards long contains 1 acre; 10 yards wide by 484 yards long contains 1 acre; 20 yards wide by 242 yards long contains 1 acre; 40 yards wide by 121 yards long contains 1 acre; 80 yards wide by 60 yards long contains 1 acre; 120 yards wide by 40 yards long contains 1 acre; 160 yards wide by 30 yards long contains 1 acre; 200 yards wide by 24 yards long contains 1 acre; 240 yards wide by 20 yards long contains 1 acre; 300 yards wide by 16 yards long contains 1 acre; 400 yards wide by 12 yards long contains 1 acre; 600 yards wide by 8 yards long contains 1 acre; 800 yards wide by 6 yards long contains 1 acre; 1,000 yards wide by 4 yards long contains 1 acre.
