The bulls and bears have not done much on exchange during the week just closed. Stocks have been almost unmovable and not much of a trading inclination has been made manifest, while figures although not dropping very materially were down to bedrock and the market is a very demoralized one.

Today's work in the pit was the best during the entire week, trading being better distributed than formerly and bringing out stocks that heretofore have not done much in the pit.
