PHILLIPS CORNERS MAY CORN.

Took 2.500,000 Bus, of Corn and 1,500,000 Bus. of Oats.

Chicago, May 1 .- Developments on the oard of trade today are said to indicate that George H. Phillips, the bull leader, has successfully run a corner in both May corn and May oats. On May contracts he took in about 2,500,000 bushels of corn and 1,500,000 bushels of Oats this morning. May corn opened at 49 to 48bg. Shorts bid the market up to io cents, the price Phillips said the op. tion would reach, during the first hour and half. Phillips himself helped bid the price up, Phillips sold corn at 50c. Shorts in May oats seemed to be in his power, the price advancing early from 267% to 281%, making a new high record. The assumption that the markets have been cornered is based chiefly on the fact that the deliveries of corn and oats today account for nearly all the contract stocks now in store, Those who have sold have until the end of the month to deliver. Whether the short interest in corn is a large one only Phillips can tell, and he says it would

not be policy to do so. He did say, however, that the line of corn controlled him is very large. His oats line also of imposing proportions.
