THAT POLICE SCANDAL.

The long delayed report of the committee of investigation into the charges made by the police against the Mayor, and the City Council, was presented to the City Council last evening. A minority report was also submitted and adopted by a majority vote of the Council. It exonerated the Mayor from the principal charges against him, and recommended that Captain Parker be re-elected to the rank and file of the police. It also recommended that Sergeant Glenn be dismissed from the force.

The action taken would have prevailed but for a middle which arose over a misapprehension of the power of the Council and of the Mayor, and the exact bearings of the minority report. It is true that the City Council cannot remove any officer or member of the police by a two-thirds vote. But the Police of the city are appointed by the Mayor, and he may remove them at pleasure. This is provided for by ordinance and the amendments to the Charter provide:

"The Mayor shall have power to remove any officer appointed by him, whenever he shall be of the opinion that the interests of the city require it, and he shall report the removal of such officer to the Council at its next regular session."—Article 3, section 6.

Under these provisions the Mayor can remove a police officer whenever he thinks proper and need not ask the Council's consent, but he must report his action to that body with the reasons for it.

The adoption of the minority report did not, in our view, involve an attempt by the Council to remove any officer or degrade him to a lower rank. It would amount only to a recommendation, and the Mayor could have acted on that recommendation, if the action proceeded that followed had not occurred. The objection of Councilman Anderson did not apply, the motion to reconsider was unnecessary. The adoption of the report could have remained, and the Mayor would, no doubt, have acted on the recommendation of the majority of the Council.

As to the merits of the case, and of the two reports the public can judge only by reading the testimony, a correct summary of which we are able to furnish today. A brief synopsis was published in the Times last evening, which the Tribune charges was stolen from its competing rivals, and which was manufactured out of the Mayor's report. The Tribune obtained the report surreptitiously, as the general understanding was that the proceedings should be kept secret, at any rate until after the report were made to the City Council.

Now that the matter is made public we have secured a correct account of the proceedings, which we give to our readers today. We understand, however, that though secrecy was explained, there was no admission taken or demanded of either of the committees to preserve it. There can be no good purpose served now in covering the matter up.

It is evident that some reforms are needed in City Hall circles, but the disclosure makes it clear that the disclosure is itself, as well as a sensational and terrible a scandal as promised when the charges were first revealed. Yet the committee of officers warrant sharp action on the part of the Mayor and Council, and the expert the authorities to exercise right of home if they desire to remove abuses and preserve the order and welfare of the city.

The minority report should be taken up at the next meeting of the Council, and action be taken with a matured understanding of its purport and the powers of the Mayor.
