POSTAGE RATES TO MEXICO.

On the First of July the new postal regulations between the United States and Mexico will go into effect. After that date, passels of merchandise may be sent through the mails from and to our neighbor republic, at the low rate of twelve cents for each pound or fraction of a pound in weight. The limit of weight is eleven pounds, and the limit of size two feet in length and four feet in width. Prepayment of postage is necessary, and other regu-lations are similar to those of domestic postage.

There are other benefits to be derived from the new regulations between the two countries which will, no doubt, be duly appreciated by merchants and the public generally.
