MUNICIPAL AFFAIRS.

Assessed Valuation of Salt Lake City Drops to About \$26,000,000.

TAX LEVY TO BE MADE FRIDAY.

Wishes to Transform the City Hall into a Jail—Council Cannot Agree to Waive to Knew Laborers.

Councilman Clark in the absence of President McArthur occupied the chair at the meeting of the City Council last night. The members present were Young, Bacon, Clawson, Hardy, Newell, O'Meara, Watson, Martin, Lyman and Clawson.

Petitions and communications were read and referred as follows:

It has been suggested to continue the petition, that the relation due the shippers would be used to cover the remaining \$15,000 of the cost of track paving. Any attempt to retain the shippers money for that purpose, the petition contends, would be unjust. Board of public works.
