This admirable provision for the rights of married women, which Ohio has just adopted has been the law in Utah for more than fifteen years. It is popularly supposed that among the "Mormons" women are deprived of the rights and privileges commonly granted to the ladies. But the fact is, that there is no part of the United States where women are accorded more liberties which they have enjoyed in this Territory under "Mormon" regulations.

Under the laws of Utah married women hold property in their own right, whether acquired or inherited before or after marriage, and they are allowed to sue and be sued in law, and transact their own business in their own name, as though they belonged to the sterner sex.

The dowry is a relic of woman's vassalage under the old English common law, is unsuited to the conditions in which woman is placed in Utah under the liberal laws in force, and only serves to emburthen and obstruct her transactions in real estate and put power into the hands of a few women who might be tempted into injustice to others, to do wrong and hinder their husbands from doing right by all members of their households.

We are glad to see Ohio moving to the front, and hope to see the day when the rest of this enlightened nation will become as far advanced in bestowing upon women the rights which they ought to enjoy under a republican form of government as the mis-represented Territory of Utah.
