Opposition Offered to the Appointment of a Receiver.

PARTNERSHIP DISAGREEMENT.

The County Board of Equalization Began its Sittings this Morning.

Chief Justice Merritt has been holding court today, but nothing of an exciting character has developed.

In the case of C. E. Devine vs L. G. Wallace, the appeal was dismissed by the defendant.

THE MOTION OFFICED.

The case of N. J. Tippins vs Charles DeMille et al was taken up on motion to complain, the motion for the appointment of a receiver being opposed.

Lieutenant and Kahn were counsel for the plaintiff and Attorney H. P. Armstrong for the defendants.

The case was set out in the complaint, as set out in the answer, to the effect that on February 1st, 1894, he was the owner of a certain tract of land in the city of Salt Lake City, containing 100 acres, and that he sold the same to Plaintiff, for \$1,000. At or about the time of the sale, Plaintiff, who was then in Germany, sent him a power of attorney, giving him authority to sell the same, and Plaintiff, having done so, sold the same to Plaintiff, his son, on February 1st, 1894. Plaintiff was the purchaser at the sale, and received the conveyance. Hence it is prayed that a receiver be appointed to take possession of the demanded premises, with authority to assess the same, collect rents, and to pay the taxes, and to the premises, Plaintiff has brought against defendants for \$1,000 damages and \$600 as the value of the rents and costs.

The defense is an almost total denial of the allegations set forth in the complaint. The case, after argument, was submitted.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

FROM THE MISSION FIELD.

Elders Return From Europe and Indian Territory.

Report on the Mission New York—An American Artist and Poem Recited by an Englishman.

Among those who returned from Europe, arriving in yesterday morning, July 18, was Elder James M. Giampaoli of this city, who has been laboring in a mission in the Swiss and German mountains. Elder Giampaoli left the city on April 5, last, proceeding to Geneva way of Liverpool. He was assigned to labor in northern Italy, where he remained for ten months, mostly among the Vaudois. He was born at Genoa, Italy, and about 18 years old when he entered the ministry. He is a man of medium height and weight, with dark hair and eyes, and a slight accent of Italian. He is a good speaker and has written articles in the newspapers of our city. From these we extract the following:

STORY OF THE MILANO.
