**CHRISTENSEN**—At Kanosh, Millard Co., Aug. 12th, 1884, Hans Christensen son of Christian and Mary Andersen. Born January 5, 1831, at Blants, Denmark. A. Kimball, which office he held at his death. Of a kind and forbearing disposition, and unwavering faith in the Gospel, he was suddenly called to labor in a higher sphere in the same great cause of human redemption.—Com.
