Permit me to say, through the columns of your paper, a few words for Cannonville, its location, prospects, etc. Cannonville is located on the head waters of Pahreah, near the south line of Garfield County, directly on the route from Salina to Lee's Ferry, via Grass Valley, the East Fork of the Sevier River and the Pahreah.
