Unfit Officials to be Promptly Removed - Rascally Officials to be Presecuted.

CHICAGO, 9.—The Inter-Ocean's Washington special says seme weeks since, the President an-nounced his intention of sifting out unfit men among federal office holders at the South. This subject has been a matter of serious and prolonged consultation between Secy. Bristow, Postmaster General Jewell, and the President. These officers had found and so reported officers had found and so reported to the President that the rule of the Benate which virtually places the whole patronage of the State in the hands of the republican sen-ator, by allowing him some decision in regard to all confirmations, had resulted in some of the States in forcing many of the most unfit men upon the public service. It was agreed that prompt and rigorous measures must be tak-en to remedy the evil, and it was decided that a searching in-vestigation should be made and changes abould follow wherever it changes should follow wherever it was found that they were demand-ed, and that hereafter the responsi-bility of rejecting fit men should be thrown upon the Senate. The first of these investigations has just been completed. The State selected for examination was Texas, where the confirmations have all been at the control of Senator Flannigan.
