The Secretary of the Interior will, in a circular letter, notify the pension agents to settle up by the end of the current quarter. A recommendation will be made to Congress to reduce the rates of fees allowed to be collected from pensioners. This is in view of the large emoluments from each consolidated office.

The Mexican border troubles were the subject of discussion at the cabinet meeting, to-day, and it was agreed that the organized cattle stealing and other depredations upon the property, in Texas, of American citizens, must be effectually stopped without further delay on the part of the Mexican authorities. Correspondence with the Mexican government will be immediately re-opened by the State Department, and unless proper steps be promptly taken by Mexico, our military forces, under General Ord, will probably be authorized to cross the Rio Grande to pursue and capture the marauders.

CHICAGO, 8.—The Journal's Washington special says the whisky men have been re-inforced here, to-day, by new arrivals from the west, who will attempt to secure an order from the President stopping the civil suits. Secretary Sherman will now consider the last batch of Chicago whisky men, four in number, who, on the plea of poverty, want to compromise the \$594,000 claim of government by paying \$800. Assistant Secretary French has given an adverse decision to these offers, and Secretary Sherman will probably approve it. The examination of the facts in the case shows that these men are neither poor nor unable to pay these amounts.

The Inter-Ocean's Washington special says, concerning the refusal of the South Carolina Senate to participate in the election of the chief justice, it is learned that the democrats, who expected to control the Senate by having the Speaker give the casting vote, counted on the support of John Cochran, who was elected as an independent republican to act as a democrat. This would make the Senate a tie. Cochran votes as often against the democrats as with them. He is not reliable on either side. He is an ex-confederate, killed a man last winter in an altercation in a bar-room, hates carpet-baggers, personally dislikes Justice Willard, and his vote is on that account general.

Boynton, of the Cincinnati Gazette, has just returned from a trip in Ohio; though a strong Hayes man, he represents that the feeling in Ohio among the republicans is almost unanimous against the President's southern policy. Boynton says the republicans could not now carry a single county in Ohio.

NEW ORLEANS, 8.—The Plymouth returned this evening from a cruise of thirty-six days up the Mississippi River, which will ever be memorable in the annals of the navy and the places visited. No sea going war vessel has been up the river for fourteen years. Demonstrations of welcome and delight and the waving of handkerchiefs greeted them from nearly every plantation along the river, and at Donaldsonville, Baton Rouge, Bayou Sara, Vidalia, Natchez, Grand Gulf, Delta and Vicksburg, business was temporarily suspended. Large and enthusiastic crowds gathered to float the national colors and fire salutes as she approached. Delegations of the most distinguished and influential citizens, headed by their mayor, went aboard and tendered the hospitalities of their several corporations. Banquets, parades, dinners, dances, drives, speeches, serenades and receptions were the frequent features of the trip. Floral tributes, particularly at Baton Rouge, Natchez and Vicksburg, were unparalleled. The greatest popular demonstration was at Vicksburg, when nearly 2,000 persons visited the ship in one day. At the various places addresses were delivered teeming with loyalty, patriotism and good feeling, all of which received grateful sympathetic responses from Capt. Barrett and his officers.

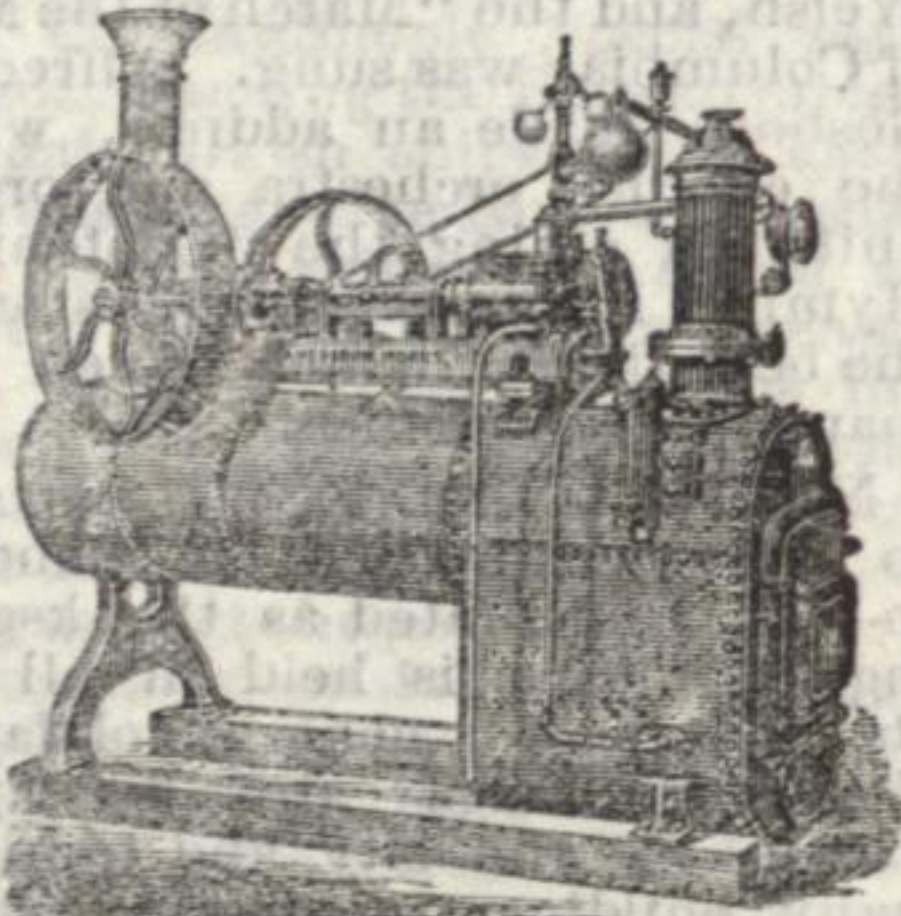

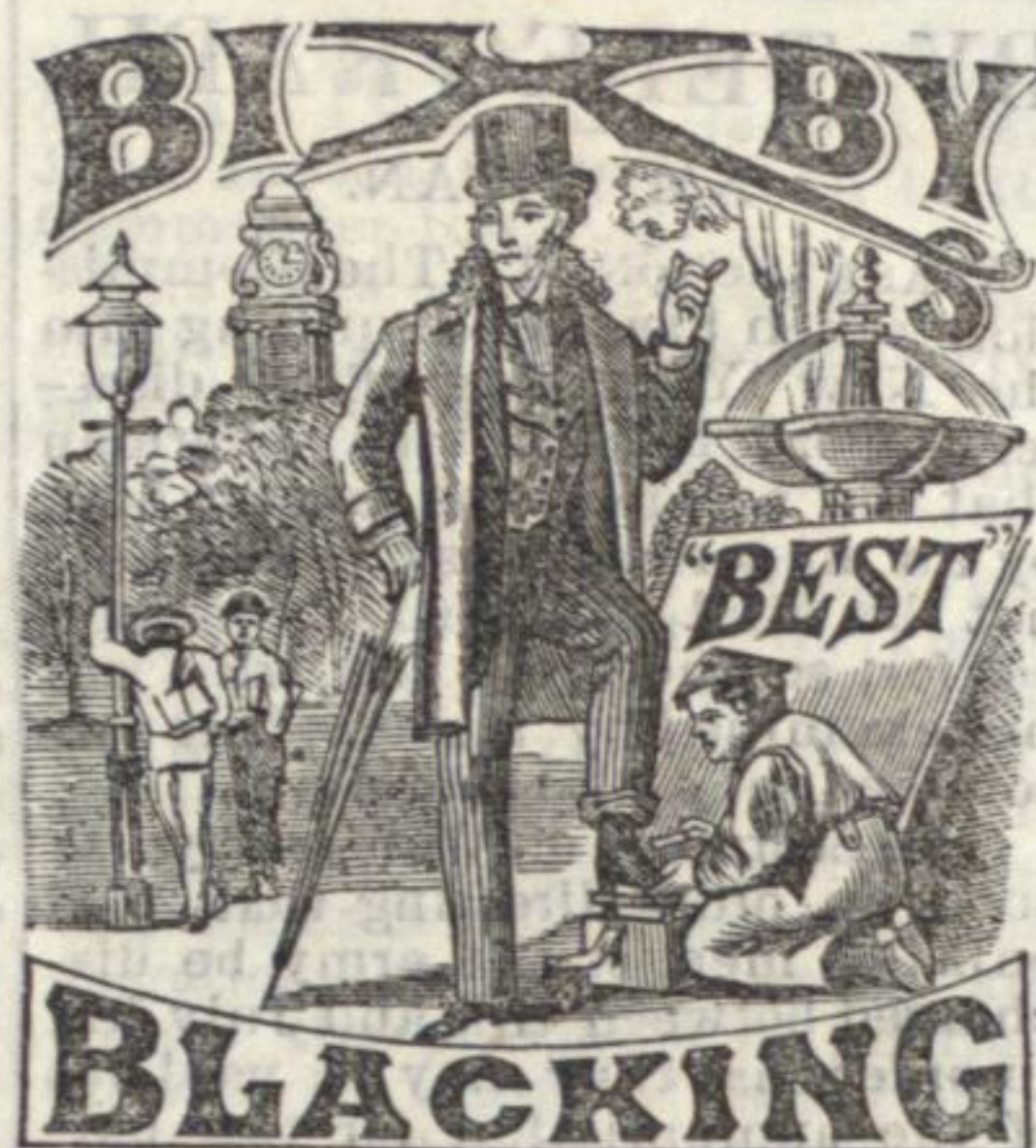
