Appropriation by \$125,000, Washington , Jan. 20.-The senate committee on public buildings and grounds today reported favorably sev-end bills increasing the limit of cost of buildings already authorized. A proposition to make another increase of \$125,000 for the postoffice building at Bolse City, Idaho, provoked a great deal of discussion, but it was reported. But objection was made because, if this amount is allowed it will mean that nearly half a million dollars will have been expended to supply a post-office building for a city of less than 25,000 people.
