PRESIDENT ON WOMAN SUFFRAGE

New York, Dec. 4 .--- The attitude of President Roosevelt and Secretary of State Elihu Root on the subject of woman suffrage was disclosed today at a meeting under the auspices of the National League of Civic Education of Women.

Dr. Lyman Abbott, editor of the Outlook, in the course of an of the Outlook, in the course of an address in opposition to granting the right to vote to women read the fol-lowing letter from President Roose-velt, which he said he read with the president's permission although it was not written "for publication, nor for this occasion."

not written "for publication, nor for this occasion." "Personally, I believe in woman's suffrage," says Mr. Roosevelt at the outset of the letter, which is dated November 10, 1908, "but I am not an enthusiastic advocate of it because I don't regard it as a very important matter. I am unable to see that there has been any special improve-ment in the position of women in those states in the west that have adopted woman suffrage, as compar-ed with those states adjoining them that have not adopted it. I don't think that giving the women suffrage will produce any marked improve-ment in the condition of women. I don't believe that it will produce any of the evils feared, and I am very certain that when women, as a whole, take any special interest in the matter they will have the suffrage if they desire it. But at present I think most of them are lukewarm; I find some actively for it and some actively against it. I am, for the rea-sons given above rather what you would regard as lukewarm or tepid in my support of it because, while I believe in it, I don't regard

t as of very much importance. I believe that man and woman shoul stand on an equality of right, but don't believe that equality of right should dieve that man and woman should stand on an equality of right, but I don't believe that equality of right means identity of function; and I am more and more convinced that the great field, the indispensible field, for the usefulness of women is as the mother of the family. It is her work in the household, in the home, her work in bearing and rearing the children, which is more than any man's work, and it is that work which should be normally the woman's special work, just as normally the man's work should be that of the breadwinner, the sup-porter of the home and, and, if neces-sary, the soldier who will fight for the home. There are exceptons as regards both man and woman; but the full and perfect life, the life of highest happi-ness and of highest usefulness to the state, is the life of the man and wom-an who are husband and wife, who live, in the partnership of love and duty, the one earning enough to keep the home, the other managing the home home, the other managing the home and children.

Dr. Abbott, who was the principal spenker at the meeting, argued against what he held would be the Liffleton of new and unnatural responsibilities and duty upon women by forcing upon them the obligations of public life. The title of his address was "The Assault on Womanhood."
