

camp with a manifesto signed by him and other chiefs, addressed to all just and sensible citizens of the United States, reciting very truly the story of their wrongs under the treaty of 1868, furnishing new particulars of the Custer massacre, and closing as follows: "Give us back our hunting grounds or such part thereof as will not interfere with the settlement and pursuits of the whites. Give us that and give us your protection." Among the incidents of the Custer massacre it states that Custer shot their flag of truce which precipitated the massacre. The whole story is very improbable. The manifesto is doubtless dictated by the Indians but prepared by the whites and half breeds living among the Sioux and evidently in the interest of the Catholics.

CHICAGO, 2.—The Times Washington special says: The interior department has information from the Gros Ventre agency, Montana, under date of June 16th, that the British Indians in Targenboe have crossed the border, that they are destroying the buffalo upon which the Gros Ventres depend largely for their support and that skirmishes have occurred between the Gros Ventres and the foreign Indians, with loss of life on both sides. The British Indians are well armed and are driving the Americans before them, the latter being in a panic and desiring to cross the Missouri River. Fifty lodges of British Indians and 100 lodges of British half breeds are reported being near the post. Information has been received at the War and State departments in order that proper action may be taken.

BANGOR, Me., 2.—The platform adopted declares that the partisan acts of Congress that withdraws the control of elections from honest electors and places it in the custody of the tools of the executive are not designed to secure an honest but to enable a fraudulent administration to perpetuate its power.

Resolved; That the power to buy up the refuse of every city under the name of deputy marshals without limit as to their number or price, and at the expense of the public treasury, and the power in the single individual minion of the Executive to arrest, with or without a warrant, as many peaceable electors as he may choose to keep from voting, are powers too dangerous to be trusted to any administration.

Resolved, That we approve of the efforts of the democratic members of Congress to secure the repeal of these outrageous and obnoxious enactments so against all the traditions of the builders of our republican system, that we do not hesitate to declare that no further appropriation should be made by Congress to carry them into effect, that we condemn the action of the republican leaders in keeping alive sectional issues and hatreds engendered by the war. That we are in favor of a currency of gold and silver and paper, the paper to be kept at par with the coin at all times, and are in favor of a free unlimited coinage of silver.

BOSTON, 2.—The single scull race for \$500 a side, between Warren Smith, of Halifax, and Evan Morris, of Pittsburgh, a distance of 1 1/2 miles and return, took place at Silver Lake yesterday afternoon. Smith won by a half length, in the fastest time on record, 21.05, the next best time being made by Hanlon at Philadelphia in 1876, 21.09

FOREIGN.

LONDON, 1.—The Duke of Cambridge has approved the proposal for a general army subscription to raise a memorial to the Prince Imperial. The subscription has already been opened.

A dispatch from Paris says: Prince Jerome Napoleon will publish a manifesto after the funeral of the Prince Imperial, urging all the Bonapartists to submit to the republic, and that he has already assured President Grevy he will not become a pretender to the Imperial throne.

A dispatch from Berlin says: The resignations of Ministers Falk, Friedenthal and Hobrecht have been made possible by Bismarck's endeavors to form a forced alliance with the ultramontanes and conservatives.

It is said in consequence of the Cabinet crisis the German Government has suspended negotiations with the ultramontanes. The report of the resignation of Minister Habrecht is semi-officially confirmed.

Many persons believe the coolness between Russia and Germany is owing to the influence of the Czar-owitch.

LONDON, 1.—The Times' correspondent at Paris says: A majority of the Bonapartists are understood to concur with Rouher in acknowledging Prince Jerome Bonaparte as chief of the Napoleonic Dynasty. They argue that the will of the late Prince Imperial, which asks ex-Empress Eugenie to co-operate with Prince Victor, was written on the assumption that the testator would survive Prince Jerome Bonaparte. This reasoning, however, is considered a transparent excuse for the non-observance of the impracticable will of the Prince Imperial. Rouher's retirement from active politics is evidently owing to the feeling that he and Prince Jerome could not act together and the latter could not be set aside. What between Prince Jerome Bonaparte and the possible adherence to the republic and the impossibility of the clerical section of Bonapartists choosing a leader without either acting against the wishes of the Prince Imperial's will, or provoking a distinct disapproval from Prince Victor, the Bonapartists are in one of the most perplexing positions ever occupied by any party.

The Queen has commanded that the troop ship *Orontes*, bringing the remains of the Prince Imperial, shall be escorted part of her voyage by the Channel fleet.

The Turkish authorities at Janina have warned the people against purchasing arms from the troops under pain of martial law.

LONDON, 2.—It is stated that on Sunday last a placard was posted on the wall of the royal palace of Lacken, Belgium, threatening the king with death if he ratified the bill passed by the Belgian Parliament depriving the clergy of the control of elementary education.

It is said that numerous groups of Bonapartists have some idea of bringing forward Jerome Bonaparte Patterson, an American, as pretender to the Napoleonic succession.

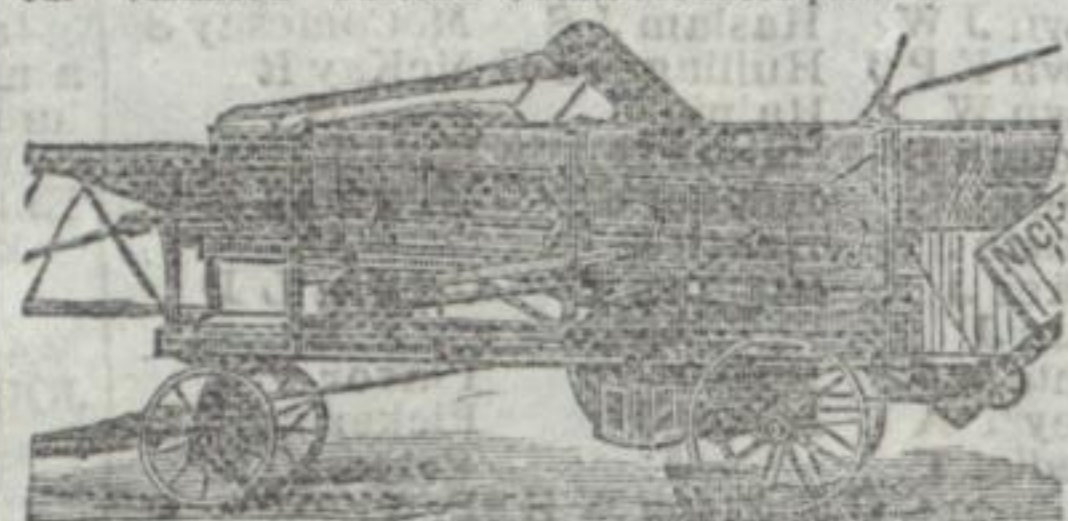
