It was raining this morning at Portland, St. Paul, Moorhead, Havre and Swift Current, and snowing at Rapid City. Thunderstorms were reported at Huron and Oklahoma city.

The temperature fell 10 degrees or more over portions of Oregon and Texas, with a marked rise over portions of Nebraska, South Dakota and Missouri.

Eddie Santy is Coming to Meet Louie Long if Game is Not Closed.

MURPHY AND NELSON LEAVE.

Fazer, One of Salt Lake Team Pitchers, Expected Here Shortly—Battling's Bout With Canole.

Manager S. J. Kelley of the Shamrock A. C., who successfully engineered the long-to-be-remembered contest between Battling Nelson and Spider Welch, announced last night that Eddie Santy, ex-featherweight champion of the world, and Louie Long, the boxer who beat Herrera recently, had agreed to come here for a twenty-round contest on the 29th of May, and that he would bring them here if the game is permitted to run.

The record of both boys is well known. Santy is the only man who ever defeated the English champion, Benny Jordan. He is a 125 or 132 pound man. His recent bouts were as follows: Knocked out Mickey Riley, in six rounds, at Milwaukee, Wis.; lost Jack Dougherty, at 15 rounds, and beat the tough Kid Sayers in two rounds. His only defeat in recent months was at the hands of the Mexican, Herrera. He beat Dick Green at catch weights in five rounds since then.

The club has another match on for June 13th, that will be of interest to devotees of the "manly art." It is between Battling Nelson and Spider Welch, the first contest to be in the Salt Palace theater and the other in the saucer track.

Manager Murphy and Nelson left for "Palo Alto" last night, where the latter is to meet Martin Canole on the 29th. Murphy said last night:

"I look for Canole to show more cleverness than Battling, but I expect my man to win in so hard and relentlessly that Canole's cleverness will do him no harm. I believe he will beat Canole as he beat Welch."

One of the pitchers signed by the management of the Salt Lake baseball team, is expected to arrive here in a day or two and report for duty. He is well known to the fans here, and will undoubtedly prove a tower of strength to the Salt Lake nine. Toner had a position in St. Louis, and at first stated he would not come here. But it seems he has changed his mind, and has notified the management that he would soon be here.
