FOURTEEN PERSONS INJURED.

At 9:30 yesterday morning, the Union Pacific westbound passenger No. 1 was wrecked at Hamilton Station, fifty-five miles east of Evanston, and fourteen persons injured.

At 10:30 last night the following particulars were obtained from the railway officials here:

As the train was passing the station it encountered a broken switch. The first engine passed over the defective point of the track all right, but the tender and the second engine left the rails and threw all the coaches and baggage cars, five in number, from the rails and off the embankment. The sleeper, however, did not go over the embankment, but was derailed.

A special was sent out, carrying physicians from Ogden, Evanston, and other points, with appliances for the care of the injured people. Very fortunately, the accident occurred at a point where the train was not crowded.
