DIED.

In the 3d Ward of this city, June 1, 1881, at 10.20 a.m., of old age, ELIZABETH EVANS, wife of John Evans, and mother of Henry and James Dinwoodey, of this city. She was born Dec. 21st, 1785, in Somersetshire, England; baptized in the Liverpool Conference, August 31, 1841, and emigrated to St. Louis in 1853, and to Salt Lake in Sept., 1855. She was an affectionate wife and mother, beloved by all who knew her, and died in full faith.

In Harrisville, Weber Co., Utah, from the effects of a paralytic stroke, on May 28, 1881, at 6 p.m., HANNAH MARIAH, wife of Joseph Taylor, and daughter of Isaac and Esther M. Harris. Deceased was born in Morganshire, South Wales, April 5th, 1834. She had been afflicted for 15 years past from the effects of other strokes. She leaves a husband, four boys and two girls to mourn her loss, the youngest being six years of age. The funeral obsequies were held at the family residence on Monday, May 30th.

In Salt Lake City, Utah, June 1, 1881, ELLA LOUISA, beloved wife of George Arbogast, aged 32 years 3 months and 10 days.

In the Fifth Ward, Salt Lake City, May 28, 1881, of diphtheria, MARY LOUISA BROWN,

daughter of Samuel J. and Elizabeth Emma Brown; aged 4 years and 4 months.

At Calls Port, Box Elder County, May 28th, 1881, of paralysis, ESTHER BOULTON PYOTT, aged 69 years, 2 months and 11 days. Sister Pyott embraced the gospel in the year 1853, in the Stockport Branch, Manchester Conference, England; emigrated to Utah in the ship Cynosure, in the year 1863.

The funeral services were conducted by Bishop Thomas Harper, on Tuesday, May 31st, quite a large cortege following the remains to the grave.

After the ceremonies of interment were completed, an affecting incident occurred that brought tears to many eyes. About a dozen little girls, from 5 to 10 years of age, brought large bunches of wild flowers, which they had collected to decorate Mother Pyott's grave.
