

THE DISTRICT COURT.

Judge Merritt Held a Very Short Session Again Today.

A WRIT OF ASSISTANCE GRANTED.

The Rock-House Case—Charges at the Penitentiary & a Convict Held in Arrest.

In less than three-quarters of an hour this morning Col. Justice Merritt did all that was required of him by attorneys in the Trial department, and then adjourned until tomorrow, when the usual trial motions will be submitted to his Honor.

PROCESSED TO SUSPENSE.

In the case of Jacob A. Dwyer vs Charles Ferguson et al., an affidavit by Frank H. Steppenwolff certifying that he was the purchaser of the property involved here in, that there had been presented to the defendant the sheriff due to the same and demand for possession had been made, but that Ferguson has refused to surrender it.

On motion of Attorney H. N. Smith, Judge Merritt therefore directed that a writ of assistance issue to the county sheriff to put Frank H. Steppenwolff in possession of the premises and maintain and defend his possession rights to time.

The facts in the case are briefly, that on December 1, 1892, the deed of ownership was sold to Steppenwolff by this court, the sheriff being directed to sell the property, the same being lots 6, 7, 8 and 9, block 81, Sandy street, Salt Lake City, for \$1,000.00, or \$100.00 per acre, a sum which, it is understood, Mr. Steppenwolff was the purchaser and the time for redemption having expired he received a deed from the sheriff, but Ferguson refused to give up the property on demand being made the present proceedings were had.

LEAVE TO APPEAL.

HELD TO THE GRAND JURY.

PROF. MARSHALL'S TURN.

He speaks on "Schools, Colleges, Universities and Boards."

At the former school today Prof. Marshall chose as the topic for his immediate talk, the subject of "Schools, Colleges, Universities and Boards."

In the early session the system generally adopted in the primary departments, or the first four years of school, like the grammar department or the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades, and the high school, or the ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades.
