ANACT

TO AMEND SECTION ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE OF THE COM. PILED LAWS OF UTAH.

Be it enacted by the Governor and

Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah: That section one hundred of Utah: That section one hundred and ninety-one of the Compiled Laws of Utah is hereby amended so read as follows: Section 191. The clerks of the county courts are hereby required to keep an accurate account of all receipts and expenditures of their respective counties, also of all debts payable to and by said counties. At the opening of the session of the County Court on the first Monday of June, annually, the said Monday of June, annually, the said court shall call for and receive the county treasurer's report, as provided in section 213 of the Compiled vided in section 213 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, of the condition of the treasury on the 31st day of May next preceding, and shall settle with said treasurer. The county clerk shall thereupon submit to the said court a statement in detail showing the receipts during the fiscal year ending on the said 31st day of May; the balance, if any, in the treasury at the close of the previous fiscal year; the expenditures during the fiscal year; the expenditures during the fiscal year just closed, specifying separately in said expenditures the amount paid to each officer, and for every other disbursement, and the balance on hand, together with a statement of all the debts payable to and by said counties.
