HINTS ON LAND MATTERS.

PREMPTIONS (Continued)

Editors Deseret News:

In continuation of the above subject, for which you have kindly afforded space in your paper, I would say that parties frequently write me, enquiring, "Whether they can prove and pay up for their land without coming to town?" To which I would reply that all cash entries, (that is proof and payment on pre-emption) must be made here; the law does not authorize County Clerks or Judges to attend to taking such proofs, nor the money for the land. Settlers have been grossly swindled by parties going through the country representing themselves as Agents of the Government, making innocent people believe that by paying the money to them and a good round fee in the bargain, they could avoid a trip to Salt Lake, and thus save time and money. Do not listen to such frauds. Cases where people have suffered from this and other dishonest practices have come under my notice, and the men they trusted have never paid the money to the receiver, or done anything towards obtaining the title whatever. The innocent settler, after waiting a year or two for his patent, writes to me to inquire, stating particulars as to who got his money, etc. and has had to again raise the \$200 to pay for his land. I can give the names of some of the persons who have done this and never made amends in any shape or form. Some ask me as to what they have to prove, and whether they can get witnesses in Salt Lake City, or if affidavits will do? To this I will reply that you must prove by witnesses present here that you have been a constant resident with your family upon the land, that you commenced living there either before or immediately after filing on the tract, and have improved the land by cultivation to some extent. These facts, together with others I need scarcely mention, show that such evidence can only be given by persons either living in the immediate neighborhood or intimately acquainted with the applicant, and his family, with the land itself and the circumstances attending the settlement and improvement of the same during the entire period since the filing. Hence you should bring two witnesses knowing to these facts, and if you are a naturalized citizen be sure and bring your full citizenship papers with you; for we have to furnish a certified copy of them to be sent to Washington with each final proof, no matter whether it be pre-emption, homestead, desert or timber culture entry. If you neglect to bring your papers it necessitates the outlay of a dollar to the clerk of the District Court for a certified copy, which we would furnish free if you had your papers from which to copy it. Some ask, "Can I file on land before I get my full papers?" You can file after taking out your first papers, but the entry cannot be perfected in any case or under any law, till you are a citizen of the United States. You can get your first papers which cost \$2.50, and file on a tract of land the same day, and you can obtain your second papers costing \$5) two years afterwards, and then perfect your entry. But as you must wait in every case till two years expire to get second papers it would be advisable for newly-arrived immigrants to obtain first papers as soon as possible. I advise this as some wish to pay up for their land at the end of six months after filing, and are liable to be prevented on account of the delay in getting their full papers. Can I file without going to the City? Yes, just inform me what tract you want, and I will institute an examination of the plats, and advise you whether there is any

any other filing on it, so that no conflict need arise from any existing claim; if it is clear and you desire it, I will send you an application to sign. This needs only a witness signature, and does not require any oath, consequently the filing can be made by me when the blank is returned.

SCIENCE AND RELIGION

FARADAY'S IDEAS OF THEIR RELATION.

Faraday's religion was of the life rather than of the lips. "In my mind religious conversation is generally in vain," he said, yet he was never ashamed to express his religious belief. The Christian religion is a revelation. The natural man cannot know it. In 1854 he delivered a course of afternoon lectures at the Institution, Prince Albert in the chair. In the opening sentences of the lecture on deficiency of judgment Faraday said, "I shall be reproached with the weakness of refusing to apply those mental operations which I think good in respect of high things to the highest; I am content to bear the reproach. Yet even in earthly matters I believe 'the invisible things of Him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead, and I have never seen anything incompatible between those things of man which can be known by the spirit of man which is within him, and those higher things concerning his future, which he cannot know by that spirit.'"

Faraday came to the study of the laws by which God governs the forces of nature, fully convinced that there could be no more noble subject for the exercise of man's intellect. But he approached the Deity in his rule over man now and forever, saying, "The Lord is in His holy temple, let all the earth keep silence before Him." In that sense the devout philosopher did keep his religion and his science apart, but he could not, and probably had no wish to keep them absolutely separate. Take for instance the following extract. "When I consider the multitude of associated forces which are diffused through nature—when I think of that calm balancing of their energies which enables those most powerful in themselves, most destructive to the world's creatures and economy, to dwell associated together and be made subservient to the wants of creation, I rise from the contemplation more than ever impressed with the wisdom, the beneficence and grandeur beyond our language to express of the Great Disposer of all."—*Sunday Afternoon for March.*

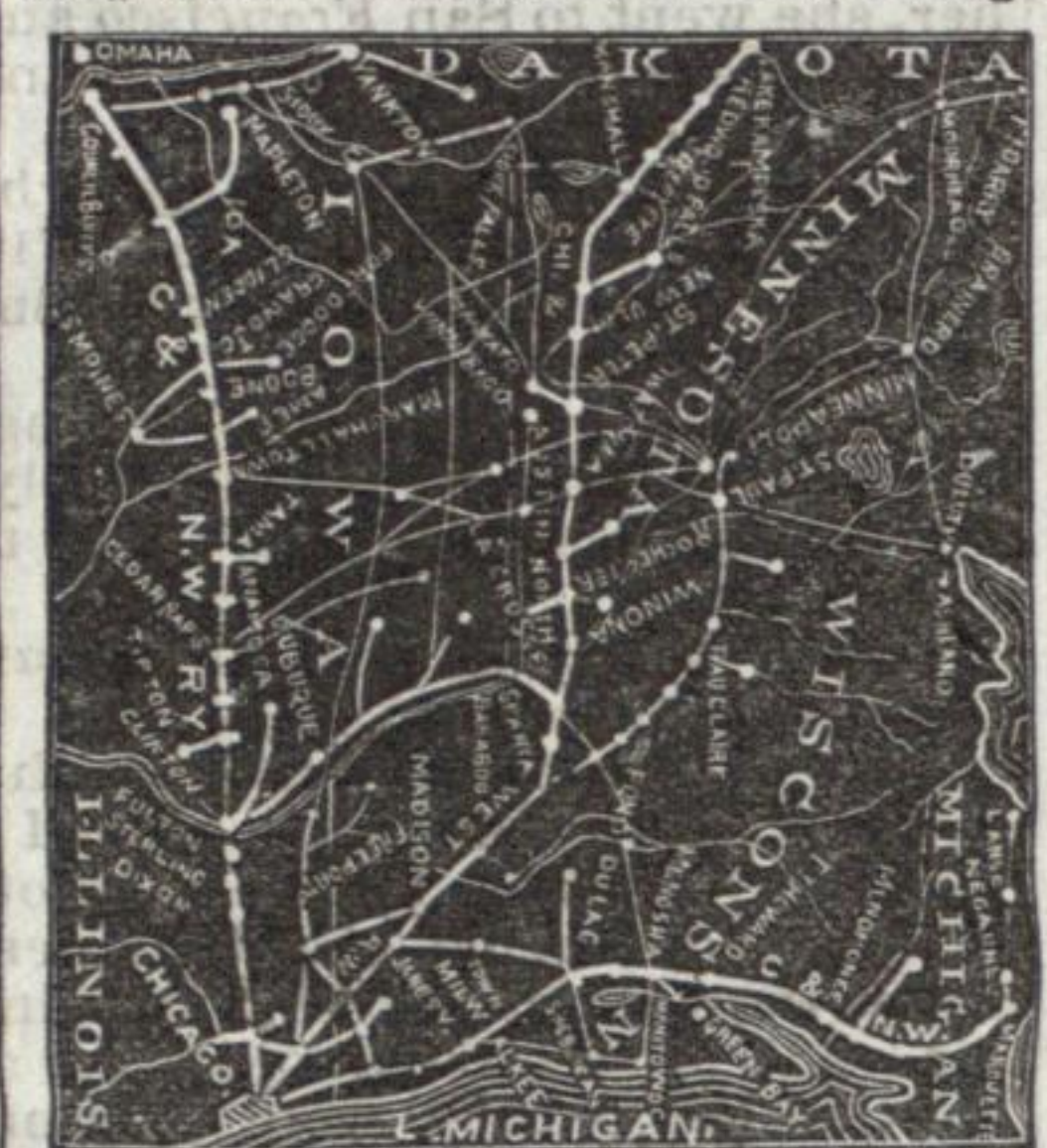

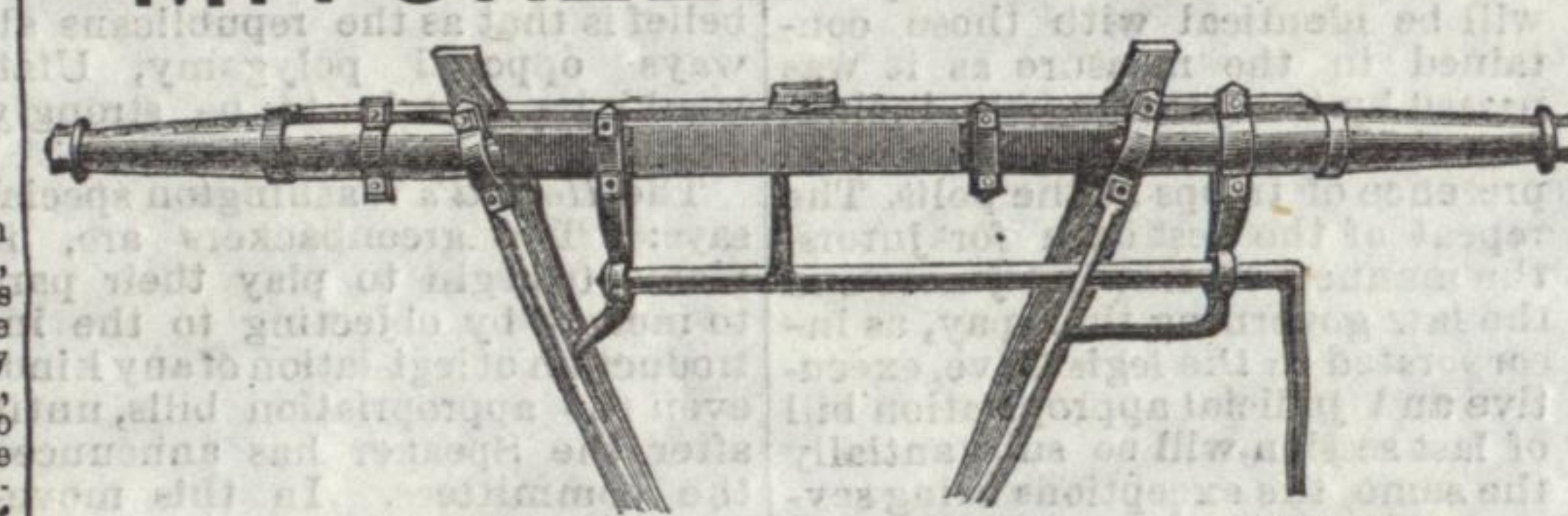
