EASTERN DISPATCHES.

NEW YORK. — The Sun says the Liberal Republicans have not failed to their pledge to back the Democrats in their contention Greeley by not coming out to vote.

The Tribune adds, the Liberal movement was at one time formidable, and had not millions been expended to arrest its progress in the State election of New York, it would have swept the country. The Liberal Republican strength in North Carolina, Vermont and Maine was nearly neutralized by the Democrats, who would not "eat crow" when they could get from five to twenty dollars each for not eating it. There was nothing purchased in the Keystone State that was not bought.

The Times says that while it regards the defeat of Charles St. John in Orange district and John H. Ketcham in Dutchess district, there is yet a certainty of having carried six districts, now represented by Democrats, so that the Congressmen-at-large, the next State delegation will be 23 Republicans to 10 Democrats, whereas at present it is 18. It estimates the assembly at the worst, at 79 Republicans to 10 Democrats.

Thousands thronged the bulletins yards at the newspaper offices and elsewhere, to hear the election news in the city.

Last night at the Cooper Institute, the Republicans assembled and speech were made, and a general justification was made in like manner.

Whitehouse, D. M., is elected to Congress in the 13th district.

BALTIMORE. — The indications are that the State will give Greeley 5,000 majority. Wilkeson, Democrat, is probably elected in the 1st district. After, Dorn, in the 2nd. In the 5th district, the contest was close. Lowndes, Rep., is elected in the 6th district by 1,500 majority.

NEWARK, N. J. — The Democrats concede the State to Grant by 5,000 majority. The legislature is Republican by a small majority.

ROCHESTER, N. Y. — Rochester gives Grant seven thousand majority, and Monroe County 3,500. Frazee, Clark, Republican, is elected to Congress in the 29th district.

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — The returns from all but four towns give Grant a majority of 44.

NEWARK, N. J. — Republicans now claim the State by 5,000.

RICHMOND, Va. — In ninety-eight precincts in thirty counties, including Richmond City, Grant has 2,093 majority. In these precincts Democrats have made but few gains, while the Republicans have gained steadily. Both parties claim the State. The Republicans claim the election of Smith for Congress, over Wise, in the 1st district.

TAMPA, Fla. — In five counties partially heard from, the estimated Republican majority is 5,000.

WILMINGTON, Del. — Grant and Wilson have carried the State by a small majority. There are large Republican gains everywhere throughout the State.



Cortland county completely returns for Grant, 1,216; Bingham, 3,602. In the county, his majority is estimated at 5,000. Nine districts in St. Lawrence and eight districts in the interior give Dix 2,822 more majority. New Jersey gives nearly sixteen thousand Republican majority, and elects six Republicans to Congress.

Wilmington, Del. — Grant's majority in the State is 61.

MADISON, Wis. — General Bishop of Wisconsin has given 15,000 Rep. majority. Williams, Elmer, Barron, Sawyer, Bank and McDill, Republicans, and
