

STRIKING DRIVERS START A RIOT.

Attempts to Send Out Wagons Met With Determined Resistance by Pickets.

NON-UNION MAN ATTACKED.

Compelled to Run for His Life—Harmless Cut—Policemen Finally Repulsed the Rioters.

Chicago, Oct. 12.—Rioting occurred today in connection with a strike of baggage wagon drivers employed by the Pullman Co. at Park A. Scott Transfer company.

At Van Buren and State streets a non-union driver of the company was attacked by the driver of an ice wagon and threatened with an axe.

Attempts to send out wagons met with determined resistance by pickets, with some drivers being stoned and attempts made to cut the horses' traces.

While going on several men, supposed to be pickets, cut the harness. The baggage wagon driver ran for his life, leaving his wagon in an alley.

Four arrests were made. One prisoner was J. W. Young, business agent of the Van and Young Transfer company.

Trains were also unobscured. The auditorium hotel, where the baggage handlers had gone on a strike, was closed.

Several express wagons loaded with mail and valises from the depot drove to the hotel and unloaded with difficulty under police guard.

A crowd of 25 men attacked one of the Scott wagons at the Park street depot while the driver was attempting to deliver baggage from one of the hotels.

Several were drawn and only the traces of the police guard were left.

One of the company's drivers got a load of trunks as far as Clinton and West Madison streets when he was pursued by a crowd of strikers and pickets gathered by pickets.

In trying to get away he turned a street corner so swiftly that he fell off the seat, striking on his head. The crowd then fled.
