WOULD STOP HIGH GRADING. Colorado Springs, Coio, Jan. 12.-Li-censing of ore purchasers as a means to stamp out the traffic in "high grade" in Colorado is proposed by the Cripple Creek Mine Gwners and Op-erators' association, and an attempt to have this idea made into law. At the annual meeting of the association held in this city, a committee was named to draft a bill to this effect. In a state-ment, Skey, Arnöld said there is now more high grading in progress than for a long time. The aim of the proposers of the new law is to reach the pro-prietors of so-called "high grade assay offices" where stolen specimens of rich ore find ready sale and make those who confluct the business liable to heavy fine and imprisonment.
