### LOCAL BRIEFS.

Very handsome green house chandeliers are being placed in the federal building corridors.

## UTAH HERDER IS SHOT AND KILLED

Dastardly Outrage Perpetrated On Sheepmen by Masked Cattlemen.

### T. H. GARSIDE THE VICTIM.

Companion Shot in the Hip But Received Only a Flesh Wound—Inquest at Carter.

(Special to the "News.")

Lyman, Wyo., Jan. 12.—News has just been received of the killing by cattlemen at a point 50 miles southeast of here, on the night of Jan. 10, of T. H. Garside of Riverton, Utah. The shooting occurred about 10 p. m., when Garside and J. A. Goodman of Evanston were asleep in bed. The former was shot through the heart, but the latter received only a flesh wound in the hip, and was forced to run about two miles in his night clothes to get away. The victims were herding sheep for Hyde & Hatch of Heber City, Utah, and had been threatened with violence by cattlemen in that vicinity. There were four men in the attacking party, two of them tall and two short.

The body of Mr. Garside has been brought here and will be taken to Carter station, where an inquest will be held by the authorities of Sweetwater county, in which county the shooting occurred.

Young Garside, the murdered sheepman, is well known in Salt Lake, and the Garside family is one of the oldest in the state. Aaron Garside, the father, having settled in early days at South Jordan.

Mr. Garside lived at Riverton. He was 25 years of age and was married four years ago to Miss Geneva Howard, and is survived by his wife and two children, the youngest being a year old. Hyde & Hatch, the sheep firm mentioned, is a well known concern of Heber City, controlling a number of herds of one of which Garside was the foreman. The news of his death has created a feeling of great sorrow throughout South Jordan and Riverton, and the sympathy of the community is being extended to the bereaved family.

Denver, Jan. 11.—An Evanston, Wyo., special to the Republican says: Masked and mounted raiders, presumed to be cattlemen, last night attacked the camps of two Utah flockmasters, near Burnt Fork, close to the Utah-Idaho line, shot down A. N. Garside and Robert Allen, herders, slaughtered the sheep and burned the camp wagons and outfits.

A camp mover who escaped the bullets of the raiders, witnessed the attack from the brush. The raiders numbered about 20 and approached the camps at a gallop, firing a fusillade of shots into the wagons. The herders were killed at the first fire. It required less than half an hour to club the sheep to death and burn the outfits, when the raiders departed.

Notions of warning to other flockmasters were left with the bodies of the dead herders. Sheepmen are indignant, threaten to get even, and more trouble is anticipated.

The range on which the outrage was committed has long been in dispute, and the sheepmen have been frequently ordered away.
