## FRAGMENTS.

The Deseret Evening News will meet tonight in the Central Hall at 7:30, to be off for the evening.

**Important Operation.**

**Death of Mrs. Zula Kimball.**  
A sad case of bereavement has occurred in the household of Brother Silas Kimball. On New Year's day gloom was brought to the family by the advent of two little strangers, a boy and a girl, to whom Mrs. Kimball gave birth. One weighed ten and the other eleven pounds, and both were healthy and strong. They were prepared for some time to be doing well, but in a few days a change for the worse set in from which she never recovered. On January (Jan. 30) this evening, at 8 P.M., she again lay down, and lay there until December 1st, when she occupied a room in the Menger building, and was there engaged in the manufacture of candlewick. The defendant, Collier, was then about 60 years old, and quite ignorant of what was going on. Witnessed Collier's name, money, and gave him in payment a sum which he did not know, and he brought back to him next day, having in the meantime made the discovery that he was a widower. When they paid him back money, he told Collier that he had done "bad stuff" for him, and Collier said it was very wrong of him to keep it. This was the last Collier knew about the whole matter.

Mrs. Lillian E. Smith, who keeps a boarding house in this city, said Collier had been here for some time, but he was not engaged in anything to do with his wife. The defendant had a board bill and ordered her to settle up with him, and she did so. Collier had been pronounced as incompetent, and he was placed in the State Hospital. Collier's wife, who was present at the time, said he was very sorry, and that he deserved it. He was then turned another \$200, and she paid him back.

The husband of the last witness and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Kimball, husband is left with five young children on his hands, two of whom are but a few days old. This is indeed a case that would bring tears to the eyes of every bereaved family, and cannot be expressed in words. On account of the relatives living in Arizona and Idaho, the funeral has been set for Thursday, and the services will be conducted in the Little City Ward chapel.

A Macklist, Edith, crashed in the Constitution Building elevator.
